THANK YOU PRESIDENT STEVE WIELAND 2014-2020

Steve Wieland joined Maroochydore SLSC as a very capable Junior Boat rower in 1976. In 1977 Steve stroked a very good Junior Boat crew to a courageous Aussies 4th placing in mountainous seas at Bancoora Beach, Victoria. Bancoora is 'around the corner' from the famous Bells Beach, it was Easter and there was a huge wave on. Highlights for Steve are competing in the 1980 Aussies Open Surf Boat final in the central arena on Maroochydore Beach and coaching our Junior Boat to Aussies Gold in 1981.

We mention these things to make the point that for 43 seasons Steve has been a top athlete and a top Lifesaver- he has featured in many tricky and dangerous rescues on our beach and in our river. He remains an Active lifesaver.

When Steve was elected President in 2014, he joined a distinguished group who have led Maroochydore SLSC for over 100 years. Though not the longest-serving leader, his six years of service puts Steve up there with Wilcox, Kelly and Stone. For the record, just before, during and after World War II, Gordon Petersen served 14 years 1939-54, some of them fighting the Japanese on the Kokoda track!

The point we are making is that Steve has done all he could in those 6 years to maintain our traditions of leadership; traditions of governance for which Maroochydore is renowned throughout Australian and International Surf Lifesaving.

Steve has been staunchly supported throughout the last 6 years by his partner Narelle Souter, a proud Life Member and Board Member of recent years. We acknowledge your unwavering support for Steve, Narelle.

On behalf of our members we say, well done and thank you President Steve. You have contributed to our story in the challenging times of modern lifesaving. Please have the rest you have earned; and, 'Go Well'.

THANK YOU CLIVE HERRALD - DIRECTOR OF SURF LIFE SAVING 2012-16, 2018-20

On 02 November 2019, just before our 'Past Members Annual Reunion', we also convened a little ceremony called 'Honouring Asho'. This was very well attended by many 'old' faces. A 1969 remastered black and white photo of Asho sweeping the surf boat 'Peter Shearer' was unveiled in our bistro, by none other than its sponsor, Peter Shearer! June Ashton was proudly in attendance, along with three of the boat crew shown in the photo - Peter Molineux (with wife Maree), Max Baldwin and Lofty Richardson. It was a most joyous occasion and highlighted Asho's brilliant career as a boat sweep, but also his continued service to our Club right up until he reached age 85.

President's Report

Steve Wieland

It gives me great pleasure to present the Annual Report for the 2019-20 season, our 104th patrolling year. A season that again has upheld our primary object of "No lives lost between our patrol flags". I commend our volunteer lifesavers on how they have pro-actively patrolled Maroochydore Beach and provided first aid treatments as required and rescues as needed. Over the last 12 months Maroochydore SLSC's 332 patrol members have:

- given approximately 12,535 hours to patrolling Maroochydore Beach;
- issued 2,299 Preventative Actions;
- provided First Aid to 291 people; and
- performed 43 rescues.

The success of Maroochydore SLSC can be measured by the contributions of its Members. Every Member who has contributed throughout the season makes our Club stronger. On behalf of the Board of Management I would like to recognise our volunteers, from those Supporters who work at our surf carnivals and events, to our coaches who take the time to train and mentor our competitors, to the trainers and assessors who gave their time to upskill and educate Members, and to our Nipper families developing little lifesavers. Thank you for being such good Club Members; the Club is in good hands with our 1093 Members.

I would like to thank Mal Pratt OAM and Ralph Devlin AM QC for their tireless work across the season providing Members with advice and direction in their role as Life Governors. On a personal note I would also like to recognise Mal and Ralph for the support and help they have given me during my time as Club President.

Member Recognition:

Mal Pratt OAM

Congratulations to Mal Pratt who was named in the 2020 Australia Day Awards when he received the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM). Mal's contribution and commitment to surf lifesaving dates back more than half-a-century. He has been a Member of Maroochydore SLSC since 1962, holding a range of roles including President (1976-79), Club Captain (1969-71 and 1975-76), Chief Instructor (1967-68), and Chief Training Officer, amongst others. He was awarded Life Membership of the Club in 1981 and is one of our current Life Governors.

Lenore Grice

Lenore Grice was granted SLSA Life Membership for her

contribution and service to the surf lifesaving movement. Starting her career in fundraising and the Women's Auxiliary, Lenore's talents expanded to become the first female coach, trainer and assessor. Lenore has made a sustained contribution at Club, Branch, State and National level. During her 40 years of service to Surf Life Saving, Lenore has shown a strong commitment to youth development, sharing knowledge and positive values with those around her.

Robin Smith, Taylah Kouvaras and Abigail Green

The incredible actions of three Maroochydore surf lifesavers saved a life. On a routine SSV patrol to the river they spotted a motionless body on the edge of the Maroochy River and their training kicked in, quickly moving the man away from the river and commencing CPR. Their actions were recognised at the National Parliamentary Friends of Surf Lifesaving function in Canberra where they were awarded SLSA National Rescue Medals.

SLSQ has also commended their rescue naming it amongst the top six performed in Queensland this season. At the time of printing SLSQ will be shortly announcing online the most outstanding rescue in the State.

The 2019-20 season started with so much enthusiasm. Little did we know that as we moved into 2020 Australia was going to experience some of the most challenging times in modern history.

In February, a Maroochydore boat crew travelled to Victoria to be starters in the George Bass Marathon. The team did not get that opportunity as the worst bush fires in many years moved east driving thousands of residents and travellers to the NSW coast. Local surf clubs and visiting surf lifesavers from around Australia gave support to the evacuees by setting up official and non-official evacuation centres. Maroochydore Members set up their tent as a cooking centre and offering First Aid and comfort to the evacuees at Bermagui.

Further, we did not know at the time that this was just the beginning of many cancellations of lifesaving events for the season. Unfortunately, our athletes were unable to compete at State Titles, Aussies Championships or World Lifesaving Championships due to COVID-19 restrictions imposed.

The hard work and dedication of our athletes to their training regime during the season will only make them more committed to perform at their best next season. I am sure that they will bounce back and give their all in the tradition of the Black Swan.

It was not only our surf lifesaving and competition sections that were impacted by restrictions due to COVID-19. The Club's vital fundraising arm, the Maroochy Supporters Club, has been severely affected as it closed for trading for a period of 79 days and re-opened with strict limitations to its patron numbers.

This significantly reduced its ability to operate all aspects of the business. The closure has impacted on the Club's finances and the projected funds available to transfer in support of the lifesaving club. Until COVID-19 is addressed this will be an ongoing issue.

Club Patrols

On Monday, 4 May we finished our last patrol for the season after eight months of patrolling our beach. Maroochy's surf lifesavers officially brought the red and yellow flags down on the 2019-20 season, with no life lost between the flags. This is a proud tradition upheld for our 104 seasons.

On behalf of the Club's Management team I would like to take this opportunity to thank each patrol Member for their outstanding efforts over the past eight months. With many challenges along the way, our dedicated team of patrolling Members upheld our motto of Vigilance and Service.

Improved Club Facilities

Repair and replacement of the support beams in the southern awning covering the female toilets and dorms area has been completed. Significant water damage occurred due to the high exposure of the awning to weather events.

Both roller doors that access the beach have been replaced with concertina doors. The new design makes it easier for the tractor and patrol arena to enter the Club premises because of the higher bulkhead height.

Carnivals

As a Club we successfully held two carnivals – the Rebel Sports Junior Activities Carnival and Murphy Builders Youth and Open Carnival. These two carnivals were highly successful due to the efforts and dedication of our workforce.

Shimoda Exchange

Maroochy SLSC and the Shimoda LSC Exchange program was once again going smoothly with Shimoda coming to Australia just before Christmas and then COVID-19 spread around the globe. For the first time since we started the exchange program, Maroochy will not be sending Club members over this season because of COVID-19 restrictions. This programme offers so much to our Members and so I hope it continues to run for many years into the future. It is a great cultural experience for Members who are involved.

To our Grants Officer Kim Musgrove, who also devotes his time patrolling as a Radio Operator, I thank you on behalf of the Board of Management for your tireless work to secure funds for the Club.

Governance

Over the last six years both Club Constitutions, Maroochy SLSC Inc. and Maroochy SLSC Supporters Club Inc., were reviewed against current legislation and SLSC, SLSQ and Club policies. The final recommendations were submitted to the Club Council and endorsed. This has been a large body of work to complete as the previous Constitutions had not been reviewed for 20 years.

The Constitution and By-Laws set in place the rules for the Management Board and associated Boards to make decisions that are in the best interest of the Club, and that their role as a Board Officer is carried out effectively. In the new Constitution regular reviews are in place to ensure the documents remain up to date.

The Club could not run without our volunteer Board officers, who work tirelessly behind the scenes. At the end of this surf lifesaving year we bid farewell to several key Club Officers who have contributed significantly to the improvement of our Club. Firstly, to Clive Herrald who has been our long-serving Director of Surf Life Saving; thank you for your service in this critical area at the Club; and secondly, Chris Wadeson who has served as our Director of Marketing.

As some leaders stand down, new leaders step up. I would like to thank Rob Elford for his tireless contributions over the past three years as Deputy President, and I wish him and his Board well for the future. They will have some hurdles to cross over the next season due to COVID-19, but they are committed to setting the future direction of the Black Swan.

Welcome to Members of the incoming Board of Management; Rob Elford (President), Gary Wilkie (Deputy President), Andrew Youngman (Director of Surf Life Saving) and Jason Childs (Director of Marketing). I wish you every success in your endeavours for our great Club. The succession planning will hold the Club in good stead as Rob is well versed in the challenges of running a Surf Life Saving Club and will have a good team around him.

To General Manager Jack Orr and the lifesaving administration staff, I thank you all for another great season working together to support the volunteers. It has made it so much easier having the help from such a committed team.

I hope all Members and their families stay safe and healthy, and wish you well for the start of the new season.

Life Member

Dale Massie



Dale Massie gained his Bronze Medallion on 06 November 1982.

From Season 1981-82 (as a Cadet) until the end of Season 1986-87 Dale patrolled and competed for the Club. A highlight was a Queensland Championship in the 1984 Junior Taplin Relay at Tannum Sands.

Dale moved away after the 1986-87 Season to pursue employment but retained his 'Past Active' membership status until Season 2001-02.

Dale was elected the Director of Marketing & Promotion in Season 2002-03 to Season 2004-05. Then followed a period of 2 Seasons as Deputy President of the Senior Club.

Dale was Director of Junior Activities (Nippers) for 7 Seasons from 2006 to 2013. During this period the competitive strength of our Nippers improved steadily until our team won the Nipper State Championship in Season 2011-12. This period of growth set our Nippers as a top-performing Club in competition which remains to this day.

By the time he retired as Nippers Chairman in 2013, Dale had served on the Club Board of Management, in various capacities, for 11 years. He also served on the Supporters Club Board for several seasons, 2004-05 to 2006-07.

Still on club administration, Dale chaired the Building Committee from 2012-13 until 2015-16. He oversaw major building works on the northern end of the Clubhouse, where fine new Nipper premises were established with the help of a major Government Grant.

In 2006 Dale was a member of the Australian Champion team in the Open Male Rescue Tube Rescue. The team was led by Jason O'Pray, in his last Aussies Gold Medal performance. Dale joined Liam Short and Nick Prass in the team.

Meanwhile, he racked up an impressive return to Masters competition. At Aussies Masters, over at least 10 Seasons, Dale won 3 Gold and a Bronze in Ski Relay and Taplin Relay Events.

Dale's wife Amanda and children Brianna and Tiarnee have each played prominent roles in our Club. Brianna and Tiarnee are prolific Australian Surf Life Saving Champions. Brianna is also pursuing an International career in Canoeing, so far representing Australia in the Under 23 Team and very recently the Australian Open Kayak Team. Brianna and Tiarnee have each represented in Branch, Queensland and Australian Surf Teams.

If elected, Dale will join dad Ian and brother Ashley as a Life Member of Maroochydore SLSC. He is recommended for election as our 88th Life Member.





Life Member Laurence Murphy

Laurie Murphy joined Maroochydhore SLSC from Etty Bay SLSC, in North Queensland, on 21 October 1986.

Laurie had obtained his Bronze Medallion at Mooloolaba on 09 September 1974.

Work commitments required Laurie to move around Queensland and Interstate, with the result that since the 1986-87 Season he has served our Club with distinction for an aggregate total of 22 years and he continues to serve. Laurie remains a proficient active lifesaver, 45 years after gaining Active status.

Best known for his feats as a boat sweep, Laurie was well-known at Maroochydhore well before he joined: in January 1986, in mountainous seas at our East-West Airlines Carnival, he skilfully and courageously piloted his Etty Bay A Grade Crew to an unlikely and memorable victory.

In his first 5 Seasons with Maroochydhore, Laurie's crews claimed two Open Boat State Titles and one Reserve Grade State Title. It was this Reserves Crew which claimed the 1989 Reserve Boat Championship of Australia, again in challenging sea conditions. Also, during that Season Laurie was the sweep of the Maroochydhore No.3 Crew which took out the 1988-89 'Palmer Tube Mills Surf Boat Classic', taking home a new surf boat and 4WD in the process.

Upon his return to our Club in the 1993-94 Season Laurie swept his A Grade crew to the Australian Championship Silver medal. Laurie was elected Boat Captain in the 1995-96 Season. It was a bumper year, with Maroochydhore fielding 3 A Grade, 5 Reserve Grade, 1 Under 21, 1 Under 19, 1 Women's Crew and 5 Masters crews. His Masters crew of 1996 claimed the Australian Masters Championship for 45-49 years.

We don't often acknowledge feats performed for other Clubs, but whilst Laurie was a member at Palm Beach in New South Wales he swept double Australian Gold for a very fine Open Women's Crew from that Club.

In 2014 Laurie swept a Maroochydhore Masters Women's crew to the Australian Surf Life Saving Masters Championships capping a magnificent career in boats.

Laurie resumed with Maroochydhore in 2007 and gained his 25-year Service Award in the 2012-13 Season.

In this latter period of 12 years Laurie stamped himself as a natural leader, with a 'world view' about Surf Lifesaving which extended far beyond Boat rowing.

In 2013 Laurie was elected a Director of Surf Life Saving Queensland, a position he still occupies today. Two of those years saw him elected Deputy President of SLSQ, where his business acumen and natural leadership skills were evident. Laurie drives the SLSQ Building Committee, which advises the SLSQ Board on future planning for the State.

Laurie's career in Surf Lifesaving has received the support of his wife Carol and their four daughters, the eldest Pip serving as our Summer Surf Girl.

Though he has travelled the Lifesaving and business world since 1974, Laurie's true Lifesaving home is at Maroochydhore, where he and Carol now maintain a home.

For his fine leadership qualities, sporting prowess and service to Lifesaving at Maroochydhore and at a State Level, Laurie Murphy is recommended for election as our 89th Life Member.

Andrew Walpole



Andy joined Maroochydore SLSC on 18 October 1999 and gained his Bronze Medallion on 07 November 1999. (Now there's a quick learner, soon to become a slick trainer).

Thus began a glittering career in Lifesaving Active Service and Instruction. Two generations of Maroochydore women and men have never known their Surf Club without Andy educating them in the finer points of rescue, Resuscitation, radios and signals.

In only his second Season Andy was awarded as a member of the most efficient patrol; by Season #3 he was Patrol Vice Captain, then a Patrol Captain for the next 8 Seasons. For 4 of those years Andy 'doubled' as First Aid Officer and spent a total of 8 years as a member of the Board of Surf Lifesaving.

Andy was elected Chief Training Officer in the 2009-10 Season. He served in that capacity for 4 Years. His teaching background informed his methods of clearly imparting surf Lifesaving knowledge to hundreds of our members. Andy continues to be a significant and willing training resource for our Club, especially at Proficiency time, throughout these last 6 Seasons after he retired as Chief Training Officer.

Needless to say, Andy has earned countless SLSC Awards over the years.

It would be remiss not to mention Andy's career as a Masters 'Beachie', with 2 State Championships in Beach Relay and many podium finishes in the individual events over the past decade and a half.

For his outstanding commitment to leadership of the training capacity within our Club, and for his exemplary record as an active Lifesaver, Andy Walpole is recommended for election as our 90th Life Member.

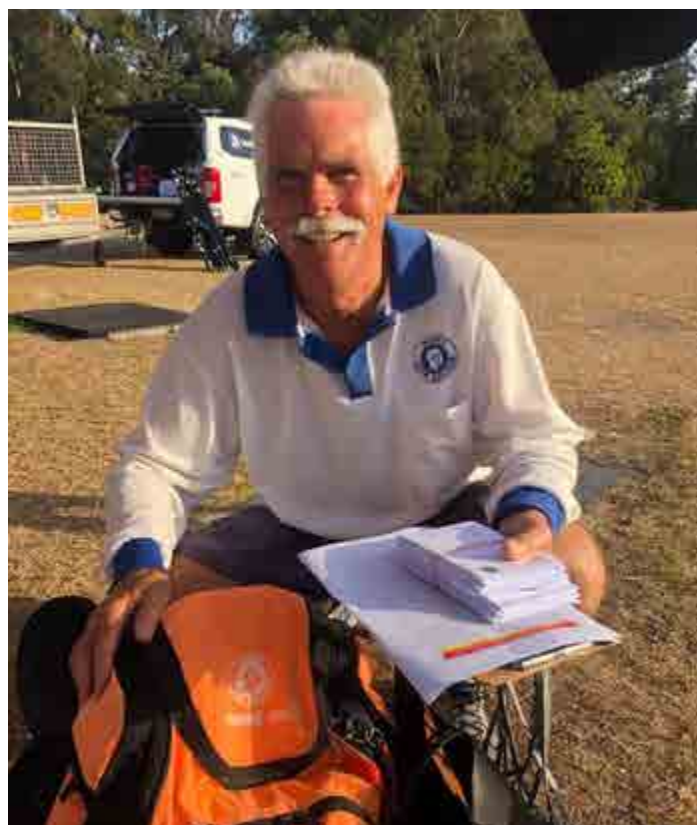

Board of Administration and Membership Report

It is my pleasure to present the Board of Administration and Membership Report to the Annual General Meeting for the 2019-20 season. Having now served Maroochydore SLSC as a member of this Board for four years, I am grateful to my predecessor, Narelle Souter, for her ongoing support in my current role as Director. I also thank other members of the Board, Jonty Dodson, Katrina Sweet and Laura Ioviero, for their valuable assistance throughout the season.

Although I held the position of Honorary Secretary for three years during the late 1970s /early 1980s, the two roles are quite different due to the more complex operations of Surf Life Saving clubs these days. In this regard I extend my appreciation to each member of the Board of Management for their support, dedication and professional governance of the Club. Officers on the various Boards are also to be commended for their important contributions to the efficient running of the Club.

Moreover, I congratulate all members who continue to make significant contributions to all aspects of the operations of the Club. During the 2019-20 season patrolling members collectively continued a strong tradition of service to the Maroochydore community, which has operated for 104 years, i.e., providing surf lifesaving services with no lives being lost between the flags. This is an achievement that every Club member should be very proud of.

The increase in membership across most categories this season, compared to 2018-19, has been quite considerable. Furthermore, over the past five years, total membership this season reached close to the highest level. With surf lifesaving being the core business of the Club, it is pleasing to note that in 2019-20 Active Membership totalled 331, which was the highest for five years. Significantly, the greatest increases occurred with Junior Active and Senior Active memberships.

Factors which contributed to these impressive membership statistics seem to be the following:

- Effectual membership retention programs especially in the younger age groups;
- Generated directly or indirectly from successful Junior Activity programs;
- Greater skills training opportunities available to members across various Award categories; and
- Net increase in transfers to Maroochydore SLSC amounted to 33 (89 in/56 out), and it is noted that many of these new members engaged actively in a range of Surf Sports programs.

To maintain this momentum in the growth of memberships post COVID-19, Youth Development, Retention, Awards Training, Junior Activities and Surf Sports programs will need to focus on strategic and effective actions to ensure that this continues to happen.

In support of members' responsibilities for maintaining beach safety through fit and well-trained patrol members, Maroochydore SLSC has produced outstanding surf sports athletes primarily through the Club's excellent coaching programs under the direction of Coach, Nathan Greig. As the surf sports athletes continue to move through to the older age divisions, the Club's competitive future looks promising.

Nevertheless, it was very disappointing that the COVID-19 restrictions prevented the staging of the Queensland and Australian Surf Life Saving Titles this season following the surf athletes' dedication to training and excellent performances during the year. As a consequence of these setbacks, the ongoing challenge for the Club will be to maintain the engagement and motivation of surf sports athletes as we move into an uncertain future.

The Board of Administration and Membership completed its two major fundraising activities earlier in the season, i.e., the Drag Queen Bingo and the Bunnings BBQ. Due to the timing of the latter, it was not possible for Youth members, who are the recipients of much of the funding, to support this fundraising event. Sincere thanks to the Senior members who stepped in to assist. It would not have been possible to run these fundraising events without your valued support.

A total of nearly \$6000 was raised and these funds were used to support membership programs throughout the season. These programs range from funding Kat Egan's weekly Stretch and Strengthening classes for members to the financial support of Youth Development and Training programs. The latter include Youth events, Youth Excellence Program (YEP), Leadership Excellence Program (LEP), Advanced Lifesaving Program (PULSE), Camp Commando and Camp Scenario. Because of the COVID19 restrictions a number of the usual programs were cancelled, notably the Branch Membership Workshop and the Branch Youth Ball.

It is also noted that Safety Officer, Nathan Moore, was supported financially by the Board of Administration and Membership to cover costs associated with his successful completion of a Certificate course.

Thank you to the Youth Development Officer, Jonty Dodson, who assisted ably with the co-ordination and the encouragement of younger members to take part in these programs.

Upon completion of the leadership course, Damon Nixon forwarded a letter to the Club expressing his gratitude for the financial support he received from the Board of Administration and Membership for his involvement in LEP:

The program included a visit to Enoggera Army Barracks where participants engaged in an intense physical training session. We heard from guest speakers on topics such as enabling change, crisis management, leadership styles, strategic planning and psychological First Aid. I also learnt key information on how to interact with younger members, which I hope will help me to learn how to increase youth

engagement, and ultimately youth retention.

A considerable amount of time this season was devoted to completing a range of amendments to the By-Laws as part of Club Constitution reform. This process followed on from the excellent work of Narelle Souter, Glynn Topfer and Ralph Devlin, together with input from Club Council and the various Boards.

Consultation with members continued with two General Meetings occurring during the season, as well as feedback from several Boards on possible By-Law changes. Subsequently, there were a number of By-Law changes which the majority of members of Club Council agreed to.

I am pleased to report that amendments and editing of the nineteen Club By-Laws is now completed. They were cross checked with the Club Constitution to ensure consistency and edited accordingly. The Club Constitution was then scrutinised again to ensure that the By-Laws aligned with significant aspects of the SLSQ Constitution Template. Approval from Club Council is the final step in this process of Constitutional reform.

Finally, but not least, I wish to thank most sincerely General Manager, Jack Orr and Club Administrators, Lauren Mulholland and Chelsea Roxburgh, for their valuable support throughout the season. This has been very much appreciated.

It is pleasing to report that our longest serving beneficiary of the group (sixth season), the holder of the Bronze Medallion Award (amongst others); the recipient of the first MPYDF/USC Scholarship, has completed her first year of a Bachelor in Paramedic Science Degree, and continues as a Patrolling member of the Club.

Another of our longer term beneficiaries obtained her Bronze Medallion late in the season, and will commence as a Patrol Member in the 2020-21 season.

Of the total number of beneficiaries, an additional four are patrolling members; eight are involved in Junior Activities; and all bar three are receiving support for swim lessons, which is expected to be ongoing for a number of seasons. Fifteen individual families in total are involved, and all are very appreciative of the support they receive.

The Foundation's major fund raiser, and what has now become a "must attend Community event", the third Annual Mid Year Golf Day, was held again in August with Port City Airconditioning coming on board for the second year in a row as Major Sponsor. on behalf of our beneficiaries we extend our sincere thanks to Daine Smith and Will Locks of Port City for their ongoing support, and indeed to all twelve sponsors who supported the day.

Another very generous and significant donation amounting to \$10,000, came from long-term sponsors Ord Minnet. Our thanks go out to Troy Derwin and Justin Scattini for their highly valued contribution to the Foundation's Working Fund, an amount that was subsequently matched by

Foundation benefactor Mal Pratt. These funds ensure the Foundation has sufficient working capital to meet the needs of our ever-increasing beneficiary base over future seasons.

The 'event' was a sellout in advance of the day, and lots of enjoyment was evident both on course and post-game at the prize presentations/raffle draws. The number of Teams in fancy dress is ever increasing and the imagination of players vying for the 'Best Team Name' Prize is evident, with this year's winner 'The Gentleman's Outing Association'.

The 'Clatworthy Hole' in remembrance of Nick and Gerry Clatworthy, was a classic, with players required to wear a long red wig when playing their tee shots. Check out some of the photographs for a giggle.

A big thank you to all who did the hard work on the day, from Majella Marsden and Jodie Crowther at Registrations and Photography, Foundation Committee Members Peter Aiken and Phil Lyons for their long stints on the Novelty Hole (yet Peter never ran out of jokes or songs), and the evergreen Nobby Clark along with Peter Dun on the XXXX Hole. The old master, Michael Rogan, again did his thing at Prize Presentations/Raffle Draws, and Marketing Manager, Jodie Crowther, again ensured all was superbly coordinated. Fellow Foundation Committeeman, Bernie Duncan, played his part on the course, and Club Manager, Jack Orr, and Surf Life Saving Club Deputy President, Rob Elford, represented the Club throughout the day.

It has now become a tradition for Foundation Benefactor Mal Pratt to carry out a 'tour of duty' of the Course throughout the afternoon, meeting and chatting with sponsors and players. However, this year he had to do it in the 'ball collecting caged buggy' as it was the only cart available. You might spot him in one of the photographs.

We look forward to again providing opportunities for the disadvantaged youth of the community in the 2020-21 season and beyond.



General Manager's Report

Jack Orr



It is my privilege as the General Manager of both Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club and Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Supporters Association to deliver this report of the operational goings-on that have occurred over the 2019-20 season.

Before providing an assessment of operational activities, I would first like to acknowledge our principle business; protecting lives on Maroochydore beach. It was yet another strong year for Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club, completing 104 years of patrolling which included about 2 300 preventative actions and 43 rescues. To the Members who volunteered their time and skills to contribute to this monumental achievement, I congratulate you.

It is commonly thought that as far as trading environments go, the Sunshine Coast is amongst the toughest markets in our industry. Given that business efficacy within the hospitality industry in a local environment such as ours is largely dependent on tourism trends, consistent trading will be forever challenging. Combine this factor, along with the significant over-saturation of licenced venues within our catchment area (including some of the region's largest venues and entertainment precincts all within walking distance) and the challenges become clear, even when trading during times of economic certainty and stability.

To compound those challenges listed above, we were also subjected to monumental government-ordered restrictions as a result of COVID-19, resulting in a complete business closure for 79 days, along with further trading restrictions impacting many more. The negative repercussions of this impact upon trade have been prodigious; however, it is with great pride that I commend all staff for the professional and patient manner in which this pandemic was handled, which subsequently allowed us to return to trading conditions as they stand today in relative comfort.

This return to trade would not have been possible if not for the tremendous success accomplished by the Supporters Association over the past twelve months. Despite COVID-19 restrictions causing a deficit in revenue, the Supporters Association managed to close

out the financial period with a comprehensive income contribution in excess of \$600 000, better than that of the prior financial year.

In large part, this remarkable result can be attributed to the significant operational alterations and restructures which resulted in a minimisation of the costs associated with trade. These areas include reduction in total employee benefits of over \$400 000; a reduction in gaming costs of almost \$70 000; a reduction in occupancy expenses in excess of \$135 000; and much more. It is with confidence that I say that Maroochy Surf Club, had it not been for the impact of COVID-19, was on track for one of its most successful years to date. As a result of these actions, and the subsequent improvement of financial standing, we can proudly state that Maroochy Surf Club has taken significant steps towards sustainability and growth.

Fiscal results aside, the success of Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Supporters Association can be further measured via independent review. Prior to the closure of club facilities as a result of COVID-19, Clubs Queensland (our industry body) conducted a number of anonymous onsite inspections of the venue, in which we achieved amazing results:

- 94.83% - Flags Bistro, Clubs Queensland Site Inspection
- 94.74% - Maroochydore SLSSA Full Venue, Clubs Queensland Site Inspection

These results were achieved through a mixture of the fantastic service offered by our dedicated team, and the actions taken throughout the year to ensure the continuous improvement of our facilities and offerings such as:

- The expansion of Club facilities, achieved by the implementation of much needed storage space, staff room and office facilities, which inhabit the new space built off the western side of the building as part of the Murphy Homes renovation;
- The repair and replacement of the supporting beams of the southern awning, which had suffered significant degradation as a result of exposure to challenging weather events;



- The roller doors underneath the Club, which were replaced with concertina doors, allowing easier access to rescue equipment and Club facilities for all members;
- The Beachview Gaming Room, which underwent significant redesigns in terms of floor layout and product offering; changes that have been warmly welcomed by all patrons;
- The re-fit of the TAB and bar area completed in conjunction with TAB, which has breathed new life into that section of our Club;
- The expansion of our courtesy bus radius, allowing for a wider spectrum of members and guests to enjoy our facilities;
- The introduction of table service to the Flags Bistro, allowing a higher level of service quality to our patrons; and
- The redesign of our promotional activities, maximising the potential efficacy of said activities whilst ensuring customer engagement.

Whilst the above actions have allowed the Supporters Association to continue to thrive and subsequently provide the funds vital to ensure safety on Maroochydoore beach, there have been a number of other great contributing components which must be recognised.

Board of Surf Life Saving Report

Well what a season it has turned out to be. States and Aussies cancelled, training all suspended, our club locked down and the bar and dining area closed, along with the upstairs function room. Having our entire facility closed has caused all sorts of issues, particularly when we were advised that our beach was to remain open, no red and yellow flags would be flown, and we were on surveillance mode only.

That in itself caused all sorts of confusion and issues with many changes taking place as the patrols were happening. We had to exercise social distancing protocols, we had to stand down all members age 65 and over which virtually included our entire radio officer members, we had to limit our roving patrols due to having limited numbers on each patrol, and we had to maintain a safe beach and perform numerous rescues with limited resources, which in itself caused some concern among the patrols that were on duty.

Having all patrols operating on a skeleton basis created a number of issues but essentially, we had to have a PC, IRB driver and crew, as well as ART/ first aid with a minimum of 3 at all times. Needless to say, that limited the roving capacity of the patrols which just added to the issues we faced.

Similarly with the club closed we were not able to access coffees or food for any on the patrols and whilst I was not able to completely cover off the coffee issue I was able to join most of the patrols and provide a sausage with onions on bread for most of the patrols. A number of the patrols also took things into their own hands and the PCs organised a sausage or even bacon and egg rolls for their patrols. Special mention goes to Danni Driscoll and Michelle Burnett who did just that by going that extra distance to support the patrols. Great effort folks and something that we will look at seriously for next season. It worked well over the final stages of patrols and could set a great model for next season.

With the commitment of a small army of volunteers this season we once again can boast that we have maintained a record of no lives lost between the flags in the history of the club, a milestone that we cannot take lightly.

There were some remarkable contributions made by a number of patrolling members with Ivan Francis again taking out the most patrol hours award having patrolled 157.5 patrol hours. I also want to acknowledge the following members who still managed to patrol more than 70 hours in spite of us going to Surveillance mode in March. These include Kiara Kliese-Walit 71.5 hours, Ben Payne 78.5 hours, Morgan Williams 72.17 hours, Ruben Zikarsky 73 hours, Andrew Brennan 86.5 Hours, Matt Chadwick 75.75 hours, Natalie Dean 82.58 hours, Kalani Kliese-Walit 123.5 hours, Stephen Lucas 95 hours, Robin Smith 73.25 hours, Franz Strasser 75.5 hours, Graham Davies 76.73 hours, Peter Greaves 97 hours, Joshua Moore 90.75 hours, Clive Herrald 96 hours, Amanda Massie 72.5 Hours, Drew Moles 81.5 hours and Kim Musgrove 89.75 hours. Fantastic effort all round and thank you all on behalf of the club for your extraordinary contribution

It would also be remiss of me not to acknowledge those who

contributed above expectations to patrols whilst we were on surveillance mode only. Noel Boxer did 33 hours, Josh Moore 29.5 hours, Natalie Dean 25.5 hours, Clive Herrald 23.5 hours, Brad Kildey 22.75 hours, Amanda Massie 22.5 hours, Michelle Burnett 22 hours, Kim Musgrove, Ben Wischusen, Tom Wischusen and Morgan Williams, all 22 hours. There were many more with less hours over this period and all of you deserve a big thank you. Without your help we would have struggled to maintain our club tradition. Well done everyone.

It would be fair to say that the conditions we experienced over the course of the season along our beach presented us with some massive challenges with more rips than usual and those rips in many instances being a lot stronger than expected. That stretched the limits on the odd occasion, particularly whilst we were operating on surveillance mode.

I cannot forget to mention the memorable events that our patrol members encountered, probably the most notable of which was the resuscitation of a 52 year old male around in Maroochy river where Robin Smith, Abigail Green and Taylah Kouvaras encountered an unconscious male lying on the water's edge during a routine roving patrol. They immediately went into resus mode and commenced CPR on the patient, administering up to 5 shocks with the defib before the ambulance arrived, a further 2 shocks being administered by the Ambos before they took him to Hospital. That afternoon the patrol members when they returned to patrol did so thinking that the patient had not made it as when he was placed in the ambulance he was not breathing.

To my surprise on Monday afternoon I received a call from the patient's wife to let me know that her husband had just woken from a coma. You can imagine my reaction to receiving that call.

I immediately took the necessary steps to nominate that for the rescue of the month the result of which was Robin Smith was flown to Canberra and was presented with a medal by our Prime minister. Well done Robin, Abigail and Taylah

Another casualty of the Corona Virus Lockdown was the running of several planned training courses, particularly for IRB drivers and crew members. Needless to say, we will look to run a few courses as soon as is practical leading into the new season on the condition that all the restrictions have been lifted. Ideally, next season we would love to see each patrol having a PC and Deputy PC with the Silver medallion Beach Management awards, at least 2 IRB drivers and IRB Crew members, as well as several First Aid and ART award holders. At the moment we do not have anywhere near these goals in place but it is a goal that we should aim for. In that vein I would ask many of our competitors to think about doing their IRB crewies and then drivers awards to give them a wider experience and to help out when needed. Driving the IRB can be a lot of fun, just ask Kalani. Not only has he done a lot of patrol hours he also helped out in the IRB at several carnivals.

I would like to encourage all members to consider taking on an additional award next season and if you held an award but have let it lapse that you consider redoing it for your own personal development as well as to assist your patrol strength.

In terms of the Board of Lifesaving members it would be remiss of me not to acknowledge the members and the contribution that each has made to the club operations this season, Andrew Youngman who took on the role of deputy director has assisted me throughout the season and I want to thank Andrew for his support. Next Season Andrew will be nominating to take on the role of Director and I will step back but remain as Deputy Director to support Andrew through the next season.

Mike Dwyer the Club CTO has made an enormous contribution to the club in past years and Mike will also be stepping back to a deputy role. Michelle Burnett has agreed to nominate for the role as CTO with Mike staying on as deputy to support over the coming season.

Nathan Moore took on the role of Club Safety Officer and went to extraordinary lengths to lift the workplace Health and Safety standards in the club and was also instrumental in our securing the sponsorship by Ego Pharmaceuticals to provide us with a large supply of hand sanitiser and Sunscreen. The actual delivery of the goods took place a matter of weeks before the sanitiser was needed with the Corona Virus problem, so well done Nathan. Nathan and his wife Tamie are also active Radio Operators but in recent weeks Nathan needed to have major surgery from previous military injuries and as a result has been out of action for the past few months. We wish him a speedy recovery and look forward to seeing them both back next season. Thanks Nathan for your contribution and support.

Graham Davies stepped up as Radio Officer following the previous incumbent moving on in a different direction. Graham was away for several months during the season and Nathan Moore stepped up to oversee the radio operators and manage the roster as needed. I particularly want to thank Graham for helping out once we were all placed onto surveillance mode and all our radio operators were stood down under the Government requirements. Graham set up the radios and Limsoc each weekend Saturday and Sunday and returned at 5 to close down and store the radios ready for the next patrol. Thanks Graham.

Phil Lyons has been the Club First Aid Officer for as long as I can remember. Phil, as always is there when needed and maintains the first aid gear and supplies season on season and then always runs the first aid tents every time we have an event on our beach. Thanks Phil.

Michelle Burnett took on the role of Gear Steward this season and has done a stellar job, with that role as well as Deputy CTO and next season stepping up as CTO is testament to her commitment to Maroochydore Surf Club.

Similarly, Drew Moles, our IRB Captain and now IRB Trainer

and Assessor has been instrumental in running the IRB section, maintaining the 5 IRBs we have as well as making sure that all of the Motors we have are running well and are repaired as and when needed. In terms of IRB trainers and assessors we now have Danni Driscoll as an IRB Trainer, with myself and Drew now accredited as IRB Trainers and Assessors to assist the club to run more IRB courses over the coming few seasons.

Steve Ellwood has been the Life Member representative on the Board for several years now and has from time to time added some counsel and guidance to the running of the board so thanks Steve for your invaluable support.

Lastly, I want to thank and acknowledge Amanda Massie and Danni Driscoll for their support and assistance over this past season. Both of these board positions were as ordinary member representative roles but under the new board structure these positions will no longer exist. To conclude I want to say I have thoroughly enjoyed my tenure as Director of Lifesaving for 5 of the last 7 years and as mentioned earlier, I will be staying on a Deputy Director next season to support Andrew Youngman as he steps up to take on the role as Director.

I will continue to support Andrew and the Board, will continue in my role as PC of Patrol 5 and will continue to be involved in Training and Assessing in the IRB area as well as Tractor and SSV training and inductions as well as maintaining my role as Club Chaplain. That will keep me busy without a doubt.

What an unparalleled end to our surf season! A few new words in the vocabulary. Self-isolation, COVID-19, Coronavirus, social-distancing and some. Similarly, new strategies to assess / reduce risk and cross-infection will be implemented across surf lifesaving.

This season was stage 2 of a rebuilding process of the training and assessment team. You will see their names within this Annual Report being acknowledged for the varying training and assessment units and qualifications necessary to deliver and provide national recognised training and qualifications to our members. In fact, our members' awards and qualifications are very much on a par with last season's excellent effort and output. Consistency.

It was pleasing to see the majority of the 8 new members who completed their new trainer's credentials in the 2018-19 season, continue on to complete their assessor's qualification this season. Eight (8) members completed the TAE40116 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment to qualify them to be full facilitators now or in the future. Seven of these were conducted within surf lifesaving. A great outcome but a milestone that could not have been achieved without the support and backing of the Board of Management – thank you for providing the opportunity to build our training and assessing capacity. Two other members completed training and assessment units of competency through surf lifesaving to keep their training and assessment skills current. One member is presently completing the trainer's award.

With new training and assessment qualifications under their belt, 5 went onto become trainers across 4WD, IRB, SSV and Bronze Medallion this season. Three (3) of these trainers went the extra mile and became assessors in IRB and Bronze Medallion. In addition to our current stock of trainers and assessors, we are in a very good place for next the few seasons, as long as we all share the load. While speaking of our, perhaps older, stalwarts of the training team. Congratulations on the various long service awards shared among you this season! There is a huge combined wealth of training and assessment experience in the group.

The greatest test of resolve for the training team is Skills Maintenance and the many days that it takes to put 330 plus members through each year. It has to be a team effort and I can never thank enough the "complete" training team, from

facilitators through to our endorsed members and helpers. We simply could not do it without you.

With the co-operation of the Board of Surf Life Saving, we put into place a Prestart Check List that is required by Workplace Health and Safety Legislation, which basically runs through all the Safety Procedures prior to operating the SSV and Tractor. This document requires minimal effort with the PC or Operators completing a checklist but ultimately serves to protect the whole of the patrol on duty.

Most members have at some time or another filled out a First Aid Incident Report Form, which is simple to complete, and this 'Rapid Check Audit Form' is even less cumbersome.

During this season, we have put up Hazchem signs where required. These signs are mandatory and visual asset to Emergency Services should an incident occur. I would also like to take the opportunity to thank both Lauren and Chelsea from the Administration team for all their help and support throughout the season.

Next season, I hope I can form a consultative group of approximately four people to get together and design a Risk Management document to assist all of our patrolling members. I look forward to meeting the incoming Risk and Safety Consultant to SLSQ and run through a Club Safety Audit early next season to see where the Club currently stands, and what improvements need to be implemented especially given the fast approaching Aussies on the Sunshine Coast next year.

In closing, I would like to thank all the members for their understanding and support throughout this difficult time of Covid-19 with the shutdown of Club amenities and I wish you all a happy and safe off season and hopefully we will see you all next Season.

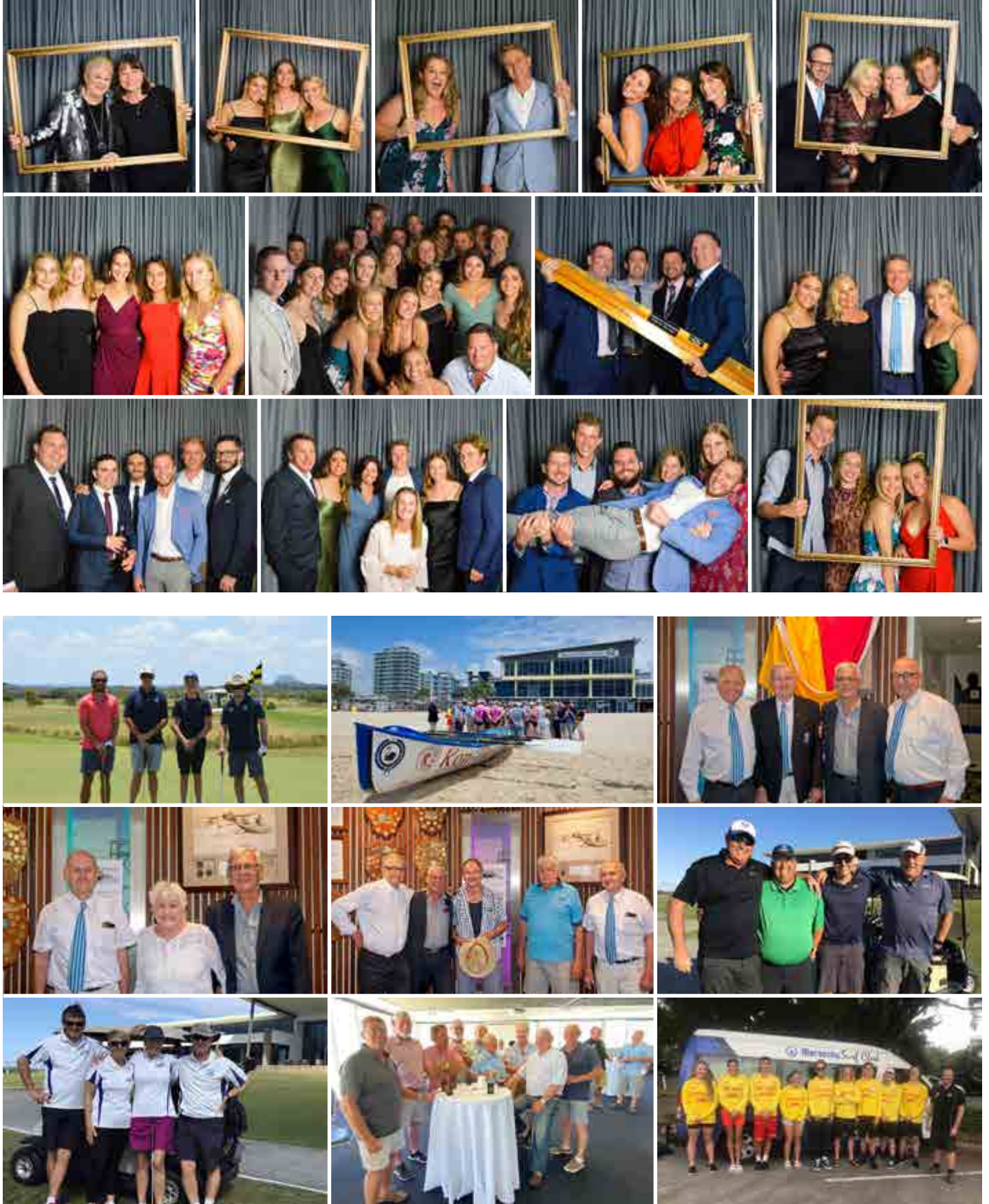

Board of Surf Sports Report

"I would not have given up. No way in hell. I wanted to finish something that I hadn't finished right.....I would have found a way and the climb back to the top of that mountain would be the best time of my career".

That was Michael Phelps response when asked what he would have done if the 2016 Olympics were postponed. Fortunately, for the greatest Olympic Champion of all time, he didn't experience what all of our athletes have experienced these past few months.

Nevertheless, "no way in hell" resonates with me. Too many early mornings; hundreds of gym sessions, too many iron run throughs to think about; thousands of laps following the black line; hot sand, aching muscles and injuries. For all these reasons you will be back very soon to continue your journey. To continue our journey. What a journey it will be.

Friday, 13 March. That was the day the Queensland and Australian Championships were cancelled together with various other major championships. The Lifesaving World Championships were to be postponed shortly after. The 2019-20 season was over in the blink of an eye and became a season like no other.

This year we can't celebrate outstanding athletic performances from States and Aussies, but I can report on the amazing way our Club came together at every level to support our fellow Club members, families and supporters. The impacts of cancelled surf sports championships are quickly dwarfed by the widespread health and economic impacts being felt by so many people.

Despite the early end to the season there were still plenty of highlights. Congratulations to Alyce and Jordan Wood who secured their spots on the Australian Canoe Team for the 2020 Olympics (to be held in 2021). Congratulations also to Hayden Cotter who is just one step away from earning a spot on the Australian Open Water Olympic Team. Our Club is so proud of all of you, not just good athletes, but more importantly good people as well.

This season we have welcomed more than 25 new competitors to the Club to strengthen the surf sports section, particularly across the Beach and Boat section, with new members also across the Swim and Craft sections. But we have a long way to go. Our goal is to double the number of competitive members. Our Club does produce individual champions but will always strive to produce champion teams. Great team performances will always lead to great individual performances.

The Fibreglass Cowboys have been reborn thanks to the efforts of Jason Bristow and support from Grant Thomas from Maroochydore Surf School with some awesome results recorded at the Queensland Championships led by Noah Andrew, who won the U17 Board Riding and was second in the Open. Again, it was a shame we did not get to see the group compete at Aussies this year, but that will come.

The season got underway with Pool Lifesaving events including the Queensland and Australian Championships conducted on the Gold Coast. Final pointscore from the Queensland Pool Rescue Championships was:

- Northcliffe 681
- Maroochydore 502
- Currumbin 452

At the Australian Pool Rescue Championships,

Maroochydore recorded a hard earned third place behind Currumbin and Northcliffe. The final pointscore was:

- Currumbin 485
- Northcliffe 387
- Maroochydore 340

Arguably the highlight of the championships for Maroochydore would have to be the Men's Open Medley Relay where Sam Bell anchored a team of young guns (average age of 16 years) to relegate the highly fancied Currumbin to the Silver medal with our other team of young guns claiming the Bronze. That Gold medal together with the Gold won in the Men's Open Obstacle Relay are the first Open Men's Relay Gold medals for Maroochydore in a decade. A sidelight to this is its great that Sam Bell has committed to competing through to 2022!

Thank you to our pool event coaches, John Baxter, Liam Short and Team Manager Nathan McGrath and our gratitude to Sunshine Coast Grammar School for access to their wonderful facility.

The resurgent Beach section under the guidance of coach Swanny achieved second place in the Queensland Beach Series; our best result ever. Through the leadership of Swanny, the team spirit and comradery generated through such an overwhelmingly positive environment was ever present and extended right through the competitive group. Once again, we didn't see our beachies compete on the big stage but have seen enough to make next season look very, very exciting.

The Boat section also experienced a very successful season with eight crews competing consistently across the season. The Boat section benefitted significantly from the return of Pat Maguire to the Club. Highlights for the season included the Reserve Men (Bin Chickens) making the Queensland Team with Corey Stone as Queensland Team Manager and the U23 Men (Meat Trays) and 200 Men winning Bronze at the 2020 ASRL Open.

Maroochydore also participated in the George Bass Marathon Boat Race (or part thereof) until the crew and support were called upon to assist bushfire ravished communities on the south coast of NSW. Congratulations to Raylene Symons and her team for their courageous efforts which were reported extensively in the media at the time and are detailed elsewhere in this report.

Maroochydore figured prominently in the Summer of Surf rounds, the local Oceans38 Carnivals and dominated the Murphy Homes Carnival and was poised to give the State Titles our most serious challenge in a decade. Maroochydore was also well represented in the Super Surf Teams rounds. A result worth noting was four of our athletes finishing in the overall top 10 of the Open Mens Surf Race – Matt Palmer 1st, Sam Short 3rd, Zac Tabuai 5th and Hayden Cotter 9th. In the professional Nutri-Grain Iron Series, Tiarnae Massie secured a much deserved start in Round 5 at North Cronulla with Adam Palmer, Lincoln Dews, Ally Clarke racing in the Iron X concept.

We are now starting to see our nextgen of young athletes winning Open Board Races, Open Surf Races and Open Board Relays. We haven't seen this for many years. There will be many of us willing these athletes to challenge the best athletes our sport has to offer in the next couple of seasons.

Tiarnee did gain a call up into the last round of the season where she performed admirably.

Next up was the "Gold" with Peter Elford and Alexandra Clarke both undertaking the long course. Peter and Ally performed above their own personal expectations and came away from the event in good spirits. Ally managed to beat a few of the Nutri Grain girls and Peter dropped about 20kg before hitting the start line, setting them both up for a solid season ahead.

As the sprint part of the season progressed, we managed to get in some quality racing with the Summer of Surf, Surf League, Murphy Holmes and the Shannon Eckstein classic. The strength of the fields at each of these events provided tight racing and solid indicators for how we were progressing. Throughout these carnivals we were always well placed and putting in a strong showing. We won numerous races across all age groups and were setting up brilliantly for a successful campaign at the State and Aussies Titles.

One of the best races all season was Adam Palmer winning the Open Ironman at the Sydney Water Surf Series at Bulli. Adam in his first year of U19 managed to knock over some of the biggest names in the sport to claim his maiden Open Ironman win!

One major positive from the season was our athletes gaining selection in representative teams. Representative teams are a fantastic reward, for the hard work and sacrifice undertaken week in week out. Team Manager's Report

It goes without saying that this competitive season has been significantly impacted by broad events across our state and country. Whether it was our team competing in the George Bass Surf Boat Marathon in January being impacted by bushfires that hit NSW, or the impact on the broader team, Club and society with the current situation with responding to Covid-19. It will certainly be a season we will never forget and look back with disappointment and a thought of 'what could have been'. However, we might also look back and reflect on the season that made us stronger and learnt together as a team.

Briefly reflecting on the success the team achieved throughout the season, which has also been well mentioned through this Annual Report, there certainly were some highlights. A high number of our Maroochydore team members were rewarded with representative honours across numerous Branch, State and Australian teams. Our athletes also competed strongly qualifying for a number of the Nutri-Grain series events and were key members in the newly formed Super Surf Teams League, competing against other teams from across Australia.

Maroochydore's continued success was typified by the team taking out the top honour at our very own Murphy Homes Maroochy Classic in January. This year's Maroochy Classic had a cracking field given the Interstate Championship was held at Alexandra Headland the day before and the new addition to the Nutri-Grain Series, the Iron X event, held on the public holiday Monday after the weekend of competition. In some of the strongest fields of the season, our athletes were able to stand out and put into practice all their skills and hard work. I have been advised on good information that this is the first time in around 20 years the Black Swan team have finished at the top of the point score at our home carnival!!

Success is certainly one measure of progress, but it is also pleasing that the team continues to grow in size and ability across all disciplines, whether it is the Beach, Boat or Surf competitors. Although we weren't able to compete at the pinnacle surf lifesaving events of the season being States and Aussies, nominations for both events continue to grow. We had over 125 nominations for States and 165 athletes ready to compete at Aussies. As a representation on the depth of our team, we had over 180 different teams in events ready to compete at States. Certainly a great sign for the Club and seasons to come.

Being new to the Team Manager role this season, what has really stood out and made me appreciate being part of the team:

- The professionalism of our athletes, coaches and administration. The amount of work and commitment that goes into the team is incredible and is a credit to everyone involved.
- The willingness of people to help out and contribute; Judy as assistant Team Manager, Lauren and Chelsea in the office, Team Managers across the different disciplines, Officials, First Aid, Handlers, people recording results or just the general willingness of people to jump in when a task needs completing. Every carnival or activity I attended this season there were at least two or three additional people offering to help in any way they could. We had over 14 Maroochydore Officials nominated for States, with our Club members willing to give up at least one day, usually multiple days, so our team could compete.
- The team work that is required to be successful. Maroochydore is a very competitive Club with a long history of success. Individual success is certainly critically important to having a strong Club and culture. However, the excitement and memories that are made when a Boat Crew, Beach Relay or Taplin Relay team work together to come out on top is infectious to be around. We had a number of great Ski results across the major Summer of Surf competitions, with notable performances from our U17s, who are starting to show their strength and dominate that division. Same applies to our U19 competitors who had to race Open division at these carnivals, and showed that they could well and truly hold their own by making the Top 16 finals! This also occurred at the Murphy Homes Carnival, where our competitors were up against the best of the country's men and women, yet continued to perform and place well in the finals.

Without States and Nationals to report on this year, I would like to acknowledge our record number of Maroochydore athletes who have achieved Australian team selection in Ocean and Ski events this season:

- Hayden Cotter – Australian Surf Lifesaving Open Team, International Rescue Challenge, Durban
- Phoebe Wills-Grace (Captain), Adam Palmer, Joe McMenamin and Zac Tabuai- Australian Surf Lifesaving Youth Team, International Rescue Challenge, Durban

I had the pleasure of attending the International Challenge in Durban, and to see our athletes in action across three tests. They absolutely did Maroochydore proud. Not only exceptional in the water, but also had the praise of the Australian coaches for their team focus; every single one of them stepped into positions they might not have normally done, such as Relays and Tube Rescues as well as their own specialist events. Special mention goes to Hayden Cotter who (after cleaning up his swim races) stepped into Ironman shoes when the 2 open team ironmen got food poisoning – we waited with bated breath for his Ski leg in the challenging conditions and he absolutely smashed it. Not bad for an open swimmer! Phoebe also showed her strength in the insane conditions, lapping the boy's leg in the Ski Relays, and winning her Single Ski races; as did Adam, who won his single on the 3rd Test, and killed his Ironman legs across all three days. Joe and Zac also showed their strength and skill in the huge washing machine that was Durban Main Beach, with all contributing to the both Australian Teams bringing home the International Challenge Cup, the Tri-Nations Cup and the Trans-Tasman Cup.

As soon as we are able, given the Covid-19 conditions, we will get back into delivering our Beginner Ski program. We have

made some updates to the program due to the success of a Grant undertaken by Kim Musgrove- thanks Kim! As a result, we have purchased three TK1s in order to get our younger members started in the safety of the river before they graduate to the Skis. Our Ski ergs have also continued to provide much needed technique training on dry land and have become core tools in the gym sessions off the water.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge our Black Swan paddlers who are excelling in other paddling areas. Congratulations to Jenaya and Tiarnee Massie to qualified for the U19 Australian Ocean Racing team, which was to race the World Championships in Portugal in September; to Jenaya Massie and Phoebe Wills-Grace who were recently selected for the U18 Australian kayaking team for the Asia Pacific Cup, in Tokyo in May; and the Australian Junior World Championship team, Germany in July. Finally, a HUGE congratulations to Alyce and Jordan Wood who have both been confirmed in the Australian Olympic Team for Tokyo 2020. Obviously, all of these events have been affected by the Covid-19 issues and mostly cancelled barr the Olympics which have been postponed to 2021. Regardless, I would just like to congratulate everyone, as being selected to represent Australia should be recognised and is an exceptional outcome for some very hard work behind the paddle.

George Bass Surf Boat Marathon

The history making Maroochydore all Female Surf Boat team contesting the 2020 George Bass Surf Boat Marathon in southern NSW woke on Tuesday morning 31 December, to the news that the event had been cancelled due to bushfires.

The team had moved to Bermagui camp site the day before, along with many other crews and support teams, ready for Day 3, and they were right in the middle of the unexpected developing bushfire emergency.

From 5am that morning the team reported that more and more vehicles from surrounding evacuated areas poured into the oval and grounds.

Our team got to work, condensing their camp site and opening up their camp kitchen to provide tea, coffee and food to the influx of people who had grabbed what they could and left in the middle of the night, not sure if they would have anything to return to.

Team Manager, Stephen Lucas, along with our IRB driver Jarryd Stringfellow; Rowers, Lauren Abraham, Tiffany Porter, Fi Fewtrell, Natalie Dean, Amanda Robb, Gesine Berger, Kate Vox and Sweep Raylene Symons all reported to the Bermagui Surf Club and were deployed to the club's workforce supporting more than 5000 evacuated residents throughout the day.

There followed an intense 36 hours for the team as the fires came within a few minutes of requiring an evacuation to the beach and ocean edge.

The sky was dark until after 10am and then glowed red and orange until another eerie red glowing darkness descended around 3pm. The town lost all power, mobile reception and the local sewerage and water filtration sub-systems during the day.

Maroochydore and other surf clubs competing in the George Bass donated food and water to the Bermagui Surf Club evacuation centre to help feed and water the evacuees after the local Woolworths was shopped dry.

A short window of opportunity saw some people get out to the north to Narooma, but the team stayed as unpredictable fires continued to burn in the surrounding bush.

The entire team pitched in and worked tirelessly throughout the day providing support, wherever it was needed. They kept going, well after the power went out, entering evacuee names into computers by torchlight until the charge went out.

It was an intense time with evacuees numbering more than three times the population of the town, and the team received a heartfelt thank you and acknowledgement for their efforts from the President Bruce McAslan and members of Bermagui SLSC. They said that the club would

never have been able to manage the volume of people by themselves.

A special mention to Lauren Abraham who joined Duty Officer Cheryl McCarthy as her scribe for the entire day. It was a long day with no downtime and the responsibility of scribing is a lot of pressure. Lauren handled it with calm professionalism and Duty Officer McCarthy thanked her for an exceptional job.

Thankfully, the team was able to evacuate south, initially to Tathra and then to Bega, before heading out via Canberra back to Sydney to make their way home.

While it's disappointing to have our team's 2020 George Bass Marathon attempt end this way, we are glad they all remained safe. Our hearts are with our NSW lifesaving family and the people of Southern NSW and Victoria who were affected by the bushfires.

Board of Finance and Resources Report

Andrew Patrick, Director

As the 2020 year closes, it has been a year we would all like to forget, but unfortunately we won't. Due to the Covid crisis, our season was cut short, with the competitors in the Club not being able to show how much it has improved in the year.

I want to make a special mention to Jason O'Pray and Danny Short for their management of their respective departments and working together with the board to ensure the budgets were maintained up until we ceased all activity on the surf sports side. Their efforts had a big effect on the Supporters side of the Club, ensuring funds were available for repairs, maintenance and renovation projects that occurred during the year, not to mention allowing us to have funds available on the Supporters side to maintain the Club during the Covid shut down, and subsequent reopening.

Another special mention to Kim Musgrove our Grants Officer, who without his dedication to the club and constant submissions for available grants, would see us have less equipment and funding for projects within the club.

Moving on to the financials as presented.

Financially wise, the active side of the Club has also performed well with the main focus of the Board to ensure there have been funds available as required for each section of the active side whilst maintaining a stable financial base for the Club. Unfortunately, as the Covid crisis hit, the Club had to look at additional funding to continue the management of the Club, however, this will be in the 2020/21 financial year.

The overall revenue of the club reduced by around \$362,000 in part due to Covid, and the lack of funds being introduced to the Club from fundraising and donations. It is important to note that the Supporters side continued to pay rent at the agreed value to the active side, despite the ability to have the rent reduced, or even deferred due to nil income on the Supporters side. The lease payment is based on EBIDTA of the Supporters Club. For the 2019 year it was 10.41%. For the 2020 year it will be \$470,360. Donations from the Supporters Club amounted to \$221,189.

Overall, the active Club incurred a loss in this financial year...\$145,713. This loss increased from the prior year loss of \$124,053. Depreciation made up a large amount of this, \$273,145. While there is an overall increase in the loss, the main factor is of course the Covid crisis, and we are confident that moving forward this will continue to move toward a positive position.

Of course, our overall expenses have been reduced. Our employee expenses reduced significantly, as we found the need to stand staff down due to Covid. Financing costs reduced down to \$9,526 from \$59,961 in 2019. This will however be addressed moving forward into the 2020/21 year. Debtors increased as expected, up around \$48,380 as we also were awaiting payments for service.

There was \$155,512 spent on renovations to the Club, with another \$30,347 in new equipment purchased for use on the beach.

On the liability side, yes, our creditors did increase, up by \$23,5231 to \$72,719, but again this was due to the club ceasing operation in March. These creditors have now been addressed and paid in full.

Borrowings increased with the combining of the loans to Supporters, as well as funding of the renovations to the club by the Supporters. This now sits at \$855,365. This loan has had initial discussions by the Board members on repayments commencing in the 2020/21 financial year... and for a period of around 10 years, but these discussions are only in the initial stages.

One positive was the reduction of the provisions of entitlement to staff, down by \$23,156, as due to Covid, staff opted to take long service leave and annual leave prior to the introduction of Jobkeeper. This now sits at \$34,934 with forward planning to keep these amounts at a more manageable level.

So, moving forward, we are in the process of creating budgets for the new year. Again, I will be encouraging the departments to continue with the processes implemented in the prior year, that is looking at entry fees paid, travel expenses, subsidies, and the overall club obligations of each Member to the Club.

These measures, whilst still difficult for the Members of the Club, are necessary until the Club is back up and running fully, once the Covid crisis has ended. Up until then, all budgets remain liquid, and can be changed at any stage. Again, I want to thank all department heads, Members and staff for the effort they have put in during this difficult financial year.

In conclusion, I have been advised by the Auditors who have finished their audit of our accounts that we meet all requirements of the ATO. For the year ending April 2020, as stated, we do not have a tax liability with the ATO.

I wish to thank all Board Members, Committees and the General Manager for their continued support and look forward to continued success for the Club going forward.



Grants Officer's Report

Kim Musgrove

To open, may I personally wish all members a healthier and brighter outlook given these extraordinary times of a worldwide pandemic affecting so many of us. You are not alone! And, together, we will all overcome this horrid situation we find ourselves in through no fault of our own.

On Sunday 22 March 2020, at about 8 pm that night, the Prime Minister announced a Nation-wide lockdown of all Clubs and Licenced premises. Thus on Monday 23 March 2020, at "High Noon" our Club locked its doors, bolted the Cold Rooms and cleared out all perishable food stocks. After a week of imaginative spacing and many challenges placed on our Board of Management and the Supporters Club, there were no further options available and little point of further discussion, never before seen in over 104 years of Club History. Now of course we have the challenge of trying to regain some normality and draw back our most excellent and loyal supporters so that we can reignite our Community Service once more. This will take some time and considerable effort but as always in the spirit of our Black Swan, by the mutual support of each other, we will be the Victor.

Because there is so very much for our Club to report, I will keep my report as brief as possible and get right to the point. Our Club has enjoyed yet another bumper year with many funding Grants being approved for the betterment of our Volunteer Members and the Club Assets in general.

In no particular order, one of the many highlights was the approval of a Grant Application from the Federal Government for a Facility Upgrade of the downstairs Male and Female Seniors Shower and Toilet Areas. This Grant has two primary and interconnected goals, one being for a new water savings device to be installed and the second being for a revamp of the wet areas to allow for more effective space allowing members to dry off and change without the hindrance of the restricted current available space to do so. The Club has a commitment to spend \$5,000.00 together with in kind work to match the Federal Government Grant of \$14,850.00 making the Facility Upgrade cost in the order of \$30,000.00. This work should commence once CV 19 restrictions are lifted.

We had another Grant from the Federal Government for a variety of miscellaneous items which would normally not receive high priority from the Club Board of Management and is meant to provide for minor items which the actual Volunteer Member would appreciate and use. These items have been approved as follows; New Patrol Marquee, New First Aid Examination and Recovery Trolley, New Binoculars, Allocated Budget for Safety and Wellbeing in preparation for the Australian National Titles in 2021 and Allocation for New I Pads for Training purposes. In this regard, thanks to our Deputy President, Rob Elford, we have secured a commitment from The Wishlist Foundation to supply the First Aid Examination and Recovery Trolley so there would be savings realised there and reallocated to another project. Additionally, I have made a further savings on the I Pads through another grant approval. This will also be reallocated to another worthy project. The above Grants represented \$5,000.00

As mentioned above, we secured another Grant for Training Purposes and in particular for I Pads for our most dedicated and excellent Trainers within the Club. This Grant was for \$2,000.00 and Mike Dwyer will be in a position to best progress this Grant.

The Queensland Government has again stepped up and provided our Club with much needed funding to cover for the following items; 2 X New IRB Motors, 2 X New Surf Rescue Boards and further funding for additional Uniforms for our Volunteer Members. This Grant is administered through SLSQ in partnership with the Department of Emergency Services representing \$10,000.00.

The Board of Management recognised and supported a request to assist our members in the Ski Section of the Club with the Sunshine Coast Council providing funding for 2 X Training Kayaks and again special thanks must go to Todd Grace for his promotion of this needed resource. The Grant for this project was \$2,000.00.

We have, over the years, established a tremendously fine association with Surf Life Saving Australia and they have once again come to the forefront and approved a Grant for the purchase of a wide range of Essential Operational Equipment including the following; Inhalo Oxygen Cylinders, Pacua Waterproof Cases, First Aid Kits, Pressure Bandages, Bleeding Control Kits, Recus Q Vac Catheters, Defib Pads, Little Annie Upgrade Kits and ICOM replacement antennas. These SLSA Grant items amounted to \$5,500.00.

And finally, another Grant from the Federal Government specifically to upgrade and install LED efficient lighting to the whole of the downstairs component of the Maroochydore SLSC is awaiting advice as to whether or not we have been successful and is valued at \$12,500.00.

It is noted that with the Facility Upgrade of the Members Shower and Toilet and the possibility of a favourable response for the above grant, the Club will in fact be in a position to save many, many thousands of dollars from reduced water usage and electricity ongoing costs which can be redirected to other areas of the General Budget Forecasts, and this savings will be ongoing for years to come.
