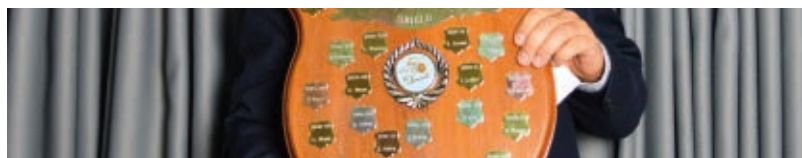
Notice of Motion 2:

Aussies Championships- a great achievement.

We would first like to recognise our Club Coaches- Nathan 'Bugsy' Greig, Todd 'Swanny' McSwan, Glen 'Pickers' Pickering, Clint 'Matey' Irwin, Lenore Grice OAM, Meggsy Brooks and all their supporting Teams of Parents who all contribute, above and beyond, to provide first class training during a long summer season.

Doug and Ron were part of an outstanding Leadership Group from 1950 to 1970. This Group laid the foundations for the modern Surf Club. They will be long remembered at Maroochy.

Excellent Ashes-laying ceremonies were conducted at the request of their families, attended by many members and former members.

We also acknowledge the passing of June Ashton, wife of 'Asho', Surf Boat sweep extraordinaire and one of our very oldest Life Members. June was a strong supporter of our Club.

LIFE MEMBER LUNCH & RECOMMENDATIONS FOR LIFE MEMBERSHIP

On 06 May 2022 the Life Governors hosted the Life Members lunch which was attended by about 50 Life Members.

The first part of the lunch occurred 'in camera', at which time the Life Member Committee presented its recommendations for election of Life Members for 2022. The lunch meeting discussed and later endorsed the Committee recommendations, which then went forward to the Board of Management and from there to the June AGM.

The process: The Life Members Nomination Committee considers, each year, ALL members who complete an aggregate of 15 years' service to Maroochydore SLSC. Those who have rendered 'long and distinguished service to the Association' and have 'displayed exemplary behaviour' (the tests set out in our Constitution) are ranked from Level 4

up to Level 1. These potential candidates are considered by the Committee each and every year. Those eventually reaching Level 1 are recommended for election by all voting members at each AGM.

The Life Member Committee for 2021-22 comprised the Life Governors (LM 1981 & 1988), Kerry Taylor (LM 1981), Glynn Topfer OAM (Committee Secretary, LM 2002) and Victoria Berry (LM 2006).

At time of writing there have been 93 Life Members elected since 1940. Deceased Life Members number 28, so we have 65 Life Members with us!

Yet again the Black Swan has registered a record year of achievement, but always remember that protection of our Residents and Visitors is our first priority. You have upheld the fine traditions handed down to you, well done all.

Life Member

Kirk Williamson

Kirk's involvement with the Club dates back 54 years, commencing in 1967 when he was a foundation member of Maroochydore SLSC's "Cygnets" programme, along with his younger brother, Brett. Maroochydore SLSC was the first Club in Queensland to commence a Nipper programme, which became official across the State in 1971.

Forever the man with the funny quip, always speaking quietly in the background, Kirk has been a 'doer' for our Club for a very long time.

Kirk joined Maroochydore SLSC officially on 07 December 1968 on his fifteenth birthday, gaining his Bronze Medallion on 02 February 1969. Life Member Buzz Taylor reports that in May of 1969, as Beach Inspector (Lifeguard), he was confronted with a mass rescue. Buzz called upon the Juniors in the Clubhouse to help. He recalls that Kirk was one of a number to respond and did so magnificently, under great pressure.

Kirk patrolled for the next five seasons until being appointed Patrol Captain in the 1973-74 season. In his very first season his patrol won the Stretton Memorial Trophy for 'Most Efficient Patrol'.

In the 1974-75 season Kirk won the Glasgow Jewellers Trophy for 'Most Improved Non-Competitive Member'.

Kirk gained his Reserve Active status in 1977-78 and Long Service membership in 1983-84.

Kirk was already becoming a key member in the Active side of our Club, but in 1974-75 season he began to turn his hand, as well, to Club administration. Kirk spent seven seasons, until 1981, as a member of 'Club Council', or in today's terminology, the 'Board of Management'.

After a year as Assistant Secretary & Registrar, Kirk was Hon. Secretary of our Club for three years, 1978-81. This period of course involved a huge involvement in the 1980 Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at Maroochydore. We were the Host Club for SLSC, the way it was done in those days, and Kirk was a key figure among many who worked very hard to make those Championships a great success.

Kirk is one of a select band of members who have been on the volunteer workforces of Aussies 1980, Aussies 2016 and Aussies 2021. Kirk has also been a regular member of our Club's Workforces and Crash Patrols at major carnivals held at our beach.

Kirk was Branch Delegate for Maroochydore Club in seasons 1984-85 and 1985-86, in effect standing in for our Club Presidents of the day, Stan Wilcox (who was State President then) and Ralph Devlin (who was new to the job). Such was the respect Kirk had within our Club 37 years ago.

Kirk received the SLSA 25 Year Service Award in 1996-97.

The 1990s and 2000s were decades in which Kirk was immersed in his Senior Mathematics teaching and school administration career, which took him to executive positions at both Brisbane Boys' College and Sommerville House. He also gained extensive academic qualifications through Honours, Masters and Doctoral Degree programmes. Kirk has recently retired from his teaching career.

Despite his career and family obligations, Kirk was never far from the Club. During 2014-16, Kirk was Chief Editor of the Maroochydore Centenary History publications.

In 2012-13 season Kirk re-engaged in active patrolling service, gaining his Radio Officers qualification. He has remained on the patrol roster for the past 9 years, amassing 18 years of patrol service in total.

In 2017-18 season Kirk also rekindled his involvement in Club governance and administration, joining the Board of Administration and Membership.

Kirk took over as Director of Administration and Membership in the 2019-20 season, upon the retirement of Narelle Souter from that position. In effect, he resumed the secretarial and registrar roles for the Club, four decades after his initial involvement in the Club's administration.

Kirk has been a member of the March Past team since its re-establishment in our Centenary year, a commitment of six years, which included podium placings at three State Championships.

Kirk Williamson is the ultimate 'quiet achiever' for Maroochydore SLSC over a long period of time; a respected member who took on responsible Club positions to advance the cause of water safety on Maroochydore Beach.

This sustained and exceptional service, for an aggregate period of almost 30 years out of 52 years of continuous membership, sees Kirk Williamson as a deserving candidate for election as Maroochydore's 92nd Life Member.

Life Member

Fiona Meredith



01 October 1998, the day when Fiona Meredith arrived at Maroochydore from Noosa Heads Surf Life Saving Club, was a significant day for our Club. Fiona has been a significant contributor to Maroochydore SLSC over the next 22 years.

At date of joining, Fiona was Branch First Aid Officer.

Fiona was granted Long Service Membership in 2004, taking into account her considerable prior service for Noosa Heads SLSC.

Fiona received her 25-year Service Award in 2010.

Fiona holds 36 Association Award qualifications.

Now to the roles Fiona has played in our Club:

Firstly, as a Champion First-Aider and as the most loyal of supporters for our First Aid community at Maroochydore, Fiona has well and truly left her mark. Fiona, as a team with Chrissy Dunn-Sargent, was already an Australian Champion in Open First Aid for Noosa Heads SLSC when they both joined Maroochydore in the 1998-99 season. In their very first season, Fiona and Chrissy added to their success story with the 1999 Open First Aid Championship of Australia our first Gold medal in that discipline, but what was to be the first of a total of 26 Australian Championships for Maroochydore SLSC in this discipline.

First Aid was a lifesaving event where each two-person team had to qualify in the top two or three at Branch and State to earn a spot at the Aussies. And when they got there, the challengers could come from anywhere in Australia and little would be known about their opponents, unless they had met in earlier Aussies contests.

In 2002 Fiona teamed with Victoria Berry to win her second Championship for Maroochydore SLSC.

In 2011 Fiona teamed with Patrick Lafferty for her third Championship.

In 2015 she teamed with Maggie Donnelly for her fourth Championship.

This is a remarkable story of longevity at the top level. Four wins with four partners in 16 years. While each of her partners was very successful in the age competitions, the Open First Aid contest is particularly fierce, and Fiona won hers with four different partners; more even than Clint Robinson did on the Open Double Ski (three partners for 7 wins in 20 years).

The ultimate achievement of 5 Gold eluded Fiona in our 'Centenary Aussies' in 2016. Teaming with her daughter Zoe

again in the Open First Aid, they were denied the Gold by the smallest of margins - one point. That would have been, for Fiona, the fairy tale ending to a great career in competition for our Club. Typically, she bore the disappointment in good grace - at least publicly!

Her story in First Aid does not end there: In the period 1999 to 2016 Fiona made herself available to be an Official for Branch, State and Australian First Aid competitions. Every year Fiona joined Lenore Grice OAM, Chrissy Dunn and parents of the day (such as Michelle Burnett, Donna Donnelly, Victoria Berry and Anne Colston) to make up a large group of Maroochydore Officials, flying our flag where it was always needed.

Fiona excelled as a mentor to all of the young First Aiders who joined Lenore's group each year to train for competition. She attended all training sessions in Maroochydore, whether she was competing that year or not. This involved travelling from Noosa or Brisbane to Maroochydore once a week, then twice, then three times a week as the season training intensified. Board of Administration and Membership Report

Kirk Williamson, Director

I am pleased to present the Board of Administration and Membership Report to the 2021-22 Annual General Meeting. From an administrative perspective, Maroochydore SLSC Inc. has met its reporting obligations for a Not-for Profit Incorporated Association.

The many successes gained throughout this season are highlighted in the 106th Annual Report and Financial Statements. I take this opportunity to acknowledge and congratulate all our Annual Club Award recipients.

Special thanks to Lauren Mulholland and Katherine Latham for their overall coordination, formatting and compilation of the Annual Report prior to being sent to the printers. Many thanks also to the members who contributed written articles and the many photographs of some key activities throughout the season. Such visual descriptions help to capture in a more insightful way the many wonderful achievements during the 2021-22 season, and thereby contribute to the ongoing documentation of our Club's enviable history.

The 2021-22 season commenced with a high level of optimism following the difficulties faced with the COVID restrictions in the previous year. However, in later half of the season, the poor weather conditions, combined with the scheduled introduction of State Government mandates in Surf Life Saving, created further uncertainty for some members.

With the many challenges along the way, patrolling members again served the community with distinction throughout the season. They volunteered an approximate aggregate of 10 000 hours patrolling Maroochydore Beach during the 2021-22 season.

Congratulations to all our dedicated patrolling members for their outstanding efforts. Maroochydore SLSC has now upheld the proud tradition of 'no lives lost between the flags' for 106 seasons. Members understand the importance of 'Vigilance and Service', and how rescues can be avoided through early interventions and preventative actions. This is a remarkable achievement that every member and supporter should find very gratifying.

Key priorities this season across Lifesaving have been to improve communications within and between patrol groups; and the ongoing development of a Club culture that embraces service to the community through active voluntarism.

It is noteworthy that the General Manager, Jack Orr, recently announced that the Maroochydore SLSC Supporter's Club will provide a 25% discount on all food and beverage purchased in the Club by active patrolling members, including Life Members and Long Service Members. This is a wonderful gesture that recognizes patrolling members' exemplary service.

Like any volunteer organisation membership strength is crucial for the long-term viability of Maroochydore SLSC

in meeting its objectives. The increase in membership numbers across many of the categories in the 2021-22 season has been commendable.

Key data relating to the retention and recruitment of members, as described in the 2021-22 Digital SLSQ Membership Statistical Reports, include:

- Membership levels as shown by the combination of Cadet, Active Junior, Active Senior, Award Members and Reserve Active Members can be seen as an indicator of the patrolling strength of the Club. For this season, Active membership has totalled 313, which is above average over the last seven-year period;
- The Chief Training Officer, Michelle Burnett, and her team are to be congratulated for their extensive and expert training of members across the full range of Awards, as well as the revamped Skills Maintenance programs. These continue to contribute to the positive outcomes for the number and skills of patrolling members;
- Compared over the past seven seasons, 2021-22 has seen a record number of Cadets, Junior Active Members and Nippers involved in the Club. This is clearly the consequence of wide-spread parental support and the excellent programs in the Junior Years, especially the quality of the coaching which they are privileged to receive;
- The retention rate for Nippers and the younger active members stands at 80-83% compared to the overall Club average of 75%. Furthermore, retention rates for our younger members are also significantly higher in the various age categories compared to most other Sunshine Coast Clubs;
- Based on the current trends in the medium to long-term, membership levels for Maroochydore SLSC seem to be dependent on the strength in the number of younger members. To further support this statement, it is noteworthy that this season there are 191 Associate members, of which over 90% are Nipper parents;
- Retention rate for our Senior Active Members in the 35-50 years age group very good at 85%, whereas in the 18-25 years age group it is much lower at 61%; this should certainly be an area of focus for future member development programs.

An extraordinary statistic impacting on membership levels is the number of net transfers to Maroochydore SLSC in 2021-22. This comprised 120 transfers IN and 33 transfers OUT, which is a net gain of 87 new members.

These transfers covered a range of membership categories, but a high proportion were members who transferred to Maroochydore to experience the comradery and the high-quality coaching within the Surf Sports training programs. Most importantly, this influx of new members should impact positively on our patrolling strength well into the future.

For comparison purposes the number of members in the various categories at Maroochydore SLSC for the past seven seasons is listed in the table below:

After achieving success in earlier carnivals, the Aussies set the scene for a magnificent conclusion to the Maroochydore Surf Sports programs this season. The outstanding results, including supporting comments are detailed in various articles in the 2021-22 Annual Report.

All athletes, coaches, managers and supporters should be congratulated for such outstanding results, which placed Maroochydore SLSC amongst the top four performing clubs in Australia. It was a real team effort, and loyalty to the Club and fellow competitors was evidenced by the athletes who competed in a full range of team events, knowing that such involvement could impact on their possible success at their individual events. Moreover, they enjoyed seeing their team mates achieve success as well.

A number of our U14 and U15 members, along with their older mentors, participated in Youth Development and Training programs during the season. These included the Youth Excellence Program (YEP), Leadership Excellence Program (LEP) and the Advanced Lifesaving Program (PULSE).

Furthermore, a large number of Youth members from Maroochydore registered for Camp Commando, but due to COVID restrictions at the time, this program was rescheduled to be held during the upcoming June-July school holidays. It is programs like Camp Commando that upskill our younger members' teamwork and leadership skills, which are so essential for our Club's future.

The Branch Youth Ball, which was held in May, was a great social occasion and proved to be very popular amongst Youth members. Including the chaperones, Maroochydore had a record 45 members attend the Ball, which they thoroughly enjoyed.

The achievements of Maroochydore SLSC and its 1143 members can be measured by the extent of the contributions of its members. Every contributing member makes our Club stronger; from those supporters who work at our surf carnivals and events; to our coaches who are generous with their time to train and mentor our competitors; to the trainers and assessors who upskill and educate our members; and to our Nipper families developing young lifesavers for the future.

I would like to take this opportunity to record my sincere thanks to the President, Rob Elford, for the support, leadership and guidance he gave to the Board of Management. Special thanks also to all other Directors and Officers in the Club for their on-going commitment to ensuring Maroochydore SLSC continues to succeed across all aspects of Club business.

My sincere thanks to the members of the Board of Administration and Membership, Tahlia McSwan (YDO), Morgan Williams and Ruben Zikarsky, who assisted in their roles this season. I am also indebted to Ralph Devlin AM QC, Narelle Souter and Glynn Topfer OAM, for their valued mentorship at critical times during the season.

I thank the hard-working staff in the Lifesaving Office under the expert guidance of Jack. In particular, I give special thanks to the Lifesaving Administrators, Lauren and Katherine, for the important role they continue to perform admirably for the Club.

General Manager's Report

It is my privilege as General Manager of both Maroochydhore Surf Life Saving Club and Maroochydhore Surf Life Saving Supporters' Association to present this report in relation to the operational goings-on which have occurred over the 2021-22 season.

Before providing a summary of functional activities, I would first like to acknowledge our core business, ensuring the protection of life on Maroochydhore Beach. We have enjoyed yet another strong year for Maroochydhore Surf Life Saving Club, completing the 106th year of patrolling, which has continued the prevention of loss of life between the flags on Maroochydhore Beach. To all of those who have volunteered their time and skills to this prodigious task, I congratulate you.

On reflection, it is accepted universally that two of the largest challenges within the hospitality sector are those of a business which is reliant upon an uncontrollable variable (such as tourism trends), or a business which resides within an area that suffers from an over-saturation of competition. How fortunate we are, we experience both!

Whilst the appeal of residing on the greatest beach in Australia is obvious, it comes hand-in-hand with the challenging fact that business efficacy shall be forever dependant on an uncontrollable variable; that being tourism. To compound our challenges, the Sunshine Coast has a remarkably high density of licenced venues; some of the largest of which are within walking distance of our Club.

The above standard hurdles are just that, regular challenges that we have come to know as the norm here at our great Club. Unfortunately, the story does not end there. To complicate matters, COVID-19 has continued to have immeasurable impacts on not only the hospitality sector, but life as we all know it. The complications surrounding vaccination mandates and snap-lockdowns added a layer of complexity to trading that has never been known before.

With that said, it is with an extreme level of pride that I commend all staff of our Club for the professional standards and exemplary level of hospitality maintained

throughout this challenging time. It is as a direct result of the unwavering work-ethic and positive, can-do attitude held by our staff that we as a Club can proudly state we have solidly withstood the proverbial storm in a state of relative comfort.

Irrespective of the challenges of COVID-19, and the withdrawal of the previously proffered safety-net of JobKeeper; Maroochydhore Surf Life Saving Supporters' Association has had yet another successful year. Posting an operating profit of almost \$1M, the tight controls and exceptional governance of our Club have ensured that we once-again managed to out-strip industry benchmarks; despite the triple-threat challenges of COVID, labour shortages and skyrocketing material prices.

This achievement is best personified by an assessment of our EBITDARD, that being 'earnings before interest, taxation, depreciation, amortization, rent and donations' which closed at 16.4%; massively surpassing the industry benchmark of 12%. It is this remarkable fiscal result that allowed the Supporters' Association to contribute over \$700,000 to the Maroochydhore Surf Life Saving Club, an increase on that of the prior two years by 25.01% and 41.77% respectively.

Setting aside the realms of finance, the success of Maroochydhore Surf Life Saving Supporters' Association is calculated further by independent reviews. Each year, Clubs Queensland (our industry body) conduct a number of anonymous inspections of the venue, review our procedures, financial information and all other operational factors; in which we achieved fantastic results (and a personal victory for yours truly as well):

- Maroochydhore SLSSA Full Venue, Clubs QLD Site Inspection- 90.54%
- Clubs Queensland Young Manager of the Year- Jack Orr

Further personifications of the great successes of our Club are too numerous to count. However, to list a few: the acquisition of a new SSV; 4th place overall at the 2022 Aussies; two successful Golf Days raising vital funds; the exceptional execution of both the Rebel and Murphy Homes carnivals; three Black Swan athletes

competing in the Nutri-Grain Iron Series; winning the 2021-22 Queensland Beach Series; numerous successes at the Coolangatta Gold; two Black Swan representatives at the Japan Olympics; numerous awards at the 2021 Sunshine Coast Surf Life Saving Awards, overall second-place at the 2021 Queensland Pool Rescue Championships and so much more. To all those involved, well done!

To wrap-up, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank a number of imperative contributors, without whom the heights obtained by our great Club would not have been possible.

- Our Sponsors; without our multitude of sponsors, including the likes of Murphy Homes and Century 21, generously providing financial aid, the activities we as a Club have become renown for would simply not be possible;
- Our staff for both Maroochy SLS Club and Maroochy SLS Supporters' Association. The success of our Supporters' Association staff is consistently personified not only in tangible reports, but also in the fact that Maroochy Surf Club is forever thought of as a 'locals favourite'. In relation to our Surf Club team, the workload taken on by these individuals is simply enormous and is done so with a passion and work-ethic unlike any other. To all of you, I say thank you;
- The Executive body, that being our Committee Members, Life Members and Life Governors. The voluntary sacrifice of valuable time by these people is what allows The Black Swan to thrive. President Rob Elford, Deputy Gary Wilkie and Treasurer Andrew Patrick have continued to provide remarkable leadership and guidance through difficult times. I congratulate you all; and
- Above all, our members, both Active and Social. From our Active Members patrolling the beach, to our Social Members providing patronage and funding, it is this combined, community effort that I believe personifies Maroochy SLS Club. To all members, for whatever role you have played, I thank you for your continued support of Maroochy SLS Club.

As many of you will know, this shall be final report as General Manager of our great Club. The achievements and friendships developed over the past thirteen-years, for which I have been employed by the Black Swan, will be forever cherished. I thoroughly look forward to continuing my relationship with Maroochy SLS Club, albeit in a volunteer (and soon-to-be nipper parent) capacity. So, in a final closing, thank you again to everyone for yet another fantastic season, and what has truly been a wonderful thirteen years!





Board of Surf Life Saving Report

Like many Surf Life Saving Clubs around the country, Maroochydore is more than just a building or a service; it's a home, a family, and it is a place where everyone has the opportunity to belong. The aspect I enjoy most is that on and away from the beach it offers a place to gather, create new friendships and to support individual and community wellbeing.

This season turned out to be one where Mother Nature has taken a starring role. Through the course of the season, particularly post-Christmas, the beach was closed for 32 (21%) patrols through floods and challenging surf conditions. Through all of this, our Patrol Captains and teams should be commended as they maintained their vigilance on the beach throughout the season.

As with each season there is a considerable effort that goes into preparing and readying the club for the start of each

season. This year's Skills Maintenance commenced with a refreshed format with a mix of Saturdays and Sundays with three sessions on each day, allowing more time for our trainers to interact with members. From our perspective it has been less rushed and allowed better engagement and hopefully more flexibility for our members.

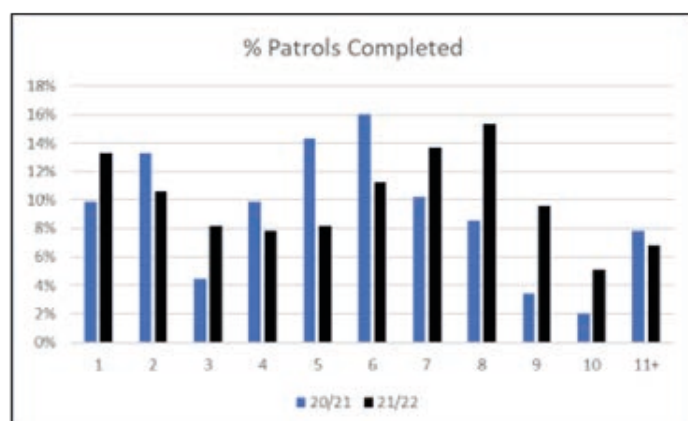
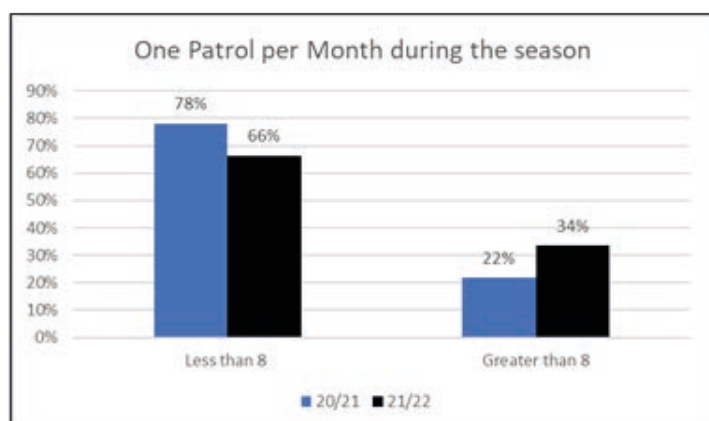
Through proficiency, proactive communication was introduced as one of the priorities for the season regardless of the setting. The Maroochydore Lifesaving TeamApp was launched to support members having greater access to information; the ability for patrol members to communicate within their teams, and most importantly, to enable Patrol Captains to have more visibility of member attendance.

Like any change it will take time for a wider adoption, but it is seen as a viable ongoing approach to communication within lifesaving moving forward.

- 1 Patrol defibrillator
- New Patrol Arena
- 6 new life jackets
- 4 sets of fins
- 2 new Rescue Boards from Kracka
- 2 new patrol First Aid Kit bags
- New SSV

While the Patrol Captains are listed elsewhere in this Annual Report, I'd like to personally thank each one of the 17 Patrol Captains for the effort you gave this season and the professional outcomes that we achieved on the beach. As we move forward into next season, I know people will be stepping down and I wish them the very best. This does provide an opportunity for new outstanding patrol members to have the opportunity to step up and become one of the excellent Patrol Captains that we have in this Club.

First Aid Officer Report

It has been my first season as First Aid Officer and I must say I have thoroughly enjoyed the challenge. A major clean-out and stocktake saw us implement a few new items including the soft pack First Aid Kit/Oxygen kit for the SSV and soft pack First Aid Kit for the Patrol arena.

We also implemented a user-friendly box on the shelf in the First Aid room for use by all members. This avoids the need to go through the First Aid Kits and take items without us knowing, leaving us short on patrol days. Thank you to all those members that have made use of the whiteboard for writing up used items. This certainly helps me each week to know what items need to be replaced without doing a full stocktake.

Our First Aid Trainers, Mike Dwyer and Andy Walpole, have once again continued to upskill and renew our First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation holders and educate new members to ensure we are able to keep our patrolling members well skilled. All members who hold the HLTAID003-Provide First Aid will need to upgrade to HLTAID011- Provide First Aid at some stage, usually as the old award expires or when an upgrade session is provided. The new HLTAID011 is now a pre-requisite for HLTAID0015 – Provide Advance Resuscitation and Oxygen Therapy which has superseded HLTAID007- Provide Advanced Resuscitation, which a lot of members hold. We commenced doing this towards the

end of 2021-22 season and will offer other opportunities as SLSQ releases its upgrade plan in the new season.

Throughout the year our First Aid members oversaw the safety of all athletes at the Rebel Sports Junior Carnival and the Murphy Homes Carnival. Thank you to all those that volunteered their time once again. I am sure it was greatly appreciated by all the athletes.

This year saw the introduction of bleeding control kits into our First Aid Kit. All members were educated on the use of the kit when they attended their Skills Maintenance. Hence the importance of attending Skills Maintenance to find out what is new to patrolling and upskilling.

As a newbie, masks, gowns and eyeglasses were introduced for use at all first aid incidences and I strongly encourage you to keep this procedure up to ensure the safety of all our members.

Special mention to Kim Musgrove for his continuance in obtaining grants for the Club that has enabled us to buy new First Aid Equipment.

Thanks to the Board of Lifesaving for all its support this season. No life lost on the beach and all first aid incidents handled with diligence and care.

Hope you all enjoy your off-season, stay safe and see you on the beach next season.

With our new plan being to run a program of three Skills Maintenance sessions per day, we were very happy to receive a lot of positive feedback. These sessions began at the Sixth Avenue training venue before heading to the beach for the wet assessments. Moving forward, this new model will be slightly tweaked to make it even more accommodating to our member base.

Once again, the September School Holiday SRC course and SRC to Bronze courses ran really smoothly. Board of Surf Sports Report

Danny Short, Director

This time last year I proudly reported our results at the 2021 Aussies were our best ever. Well, I am now even more proud to be able to report that we have done even better at the 2022 Aussies!

19 Gold, 12 Silver and 18 Bronze for a total of 49 medals across the Open and Youth Championships, placing Maroochydhore 4th on the overall Open Point Score:

Whilst we finished a close 4th (3rd in 2021), this is Maroochydhore's best ever medal haul, despite a number of events being cancelled. Our club has now won 254 Australian championships and will announce our 250th Australian champion at the Annual Dinner. With 9 medals, Joel Piper justifiably won the Most Outstanding Male Competitor Award. Interestingly, Joel is the first Maroochydhore competitor to win medals in the ocean and on the beach (U19 beach relay) at the same Australian championships.

Under the leadership of Todd McSwan, the Beach section has emerged as an Australian Championship powerhouse with 6 Australian championship Gold medals including the amazing Tom Johnston with Golds in the U17 Flags, U17 Beach Relay and Bronze in the U19 Beach Relay! Can't wait to see what Swanny and the team can achieve in Perth in 2023.

Add to these our back-to-back Australian Champions – Hayden Cotter in the Open Belt, our U19 Taplin and our U23 Mens Boat Crew; and it all adds up to an amazing championship for Maroochydhore.

Whilst Maroochydhore fell off the podium this year, we are very close now to Newport in a fight for 2nd place, and given recent transfers out of Newport, I am confident Maroochydhore can claim 2nd place in 2023. Northcliffe continue to be the benchmark across all areas of their club; Lifesaving, Surf Sports and their Supporters' Club. Invest a few minutes perusing their web site and social media and go for a walk through their club and you will see they do everything well.

The Coolangatta Gold was contested in November and Maroochydhore competitors performed admirably, headlined by Mitchell Stitt taking the U19 Long Course title (and 8th overall) and Dom Stitt taking the U19 Short Course (and 2nd overall).

The Queensland Championships were unfortunately cancelled due to extreme weather. Maroochydhore did however experience some outstanding results in the Summer of Surf series, including

the revamped Murphy Homes Maroochy Classic. A record ten of our Ironmen and Ironwomen competed in the Nutri-Grain Iron trials with Adam Palmer and Hayden Cotter winning spots in the series and joining Tiarnee Massie in the 2021-22 series.

The 2021-22 series was challenging – two rounds at North Bondi with the scheduled 3rd round rescheduled due to a Tsunami threat. The last four rounds conducted were at Kurrawa in extremely challenging conditions, and throughout the athletes dealt with ongoing COVID impacts. Tiarnee finished 12th, Adam 17th and Hayden 19th and should be congratulated on being able to complete in what turned out to be a gruelling series.

In the Nutri-Grain Next Gen series, Dom Stitt placed 2nd on countback and therefore just missed automatic qualification to the 2022-23 series. I am confident that Dom's rate of improvement will see her in the series in the not-too-distant future. In the Men's NextGen, Joel Piper finished 9th, Oliver Monaghan 10th and Mitchell Stitt 11th which proved to be a precursor to their amazing results at Aussies a few months later.

The Murphy Homes Maroochy Classic became part of the Summer of Surf Series in 2022 and adopted a more contemporary format for athletes, spectators and sponsors with over \$40,000 in prizemoney. Despite the conditions, the carnival was very successful including thousands of live stream views, VIP enclosure and expert commentary. Thank you to our major sponsors Murphy Homes and Aussie Fitness Equipment and we look forward to your support in 2023.

The Branch and Queensland Pool Lifesaving Championships were conducted with the Australian Championships cancelled for the second year running. Maroochydhore finished 2nd on the overall Point Score at States. Thank you to our pool lifesaving coaches John Baxter, Liam Short and Team Manager Nathan McGrath and our gratitude to Nathan Greig and Mountain Creek Aquatic Centre for access to their wonderful facility.

Under the leadership of Jason Bristow and with the support from coach, Grant Thomas and Maroochy Surf School, the Fibreglass Cowboys continue to grow in numbers. Noah Andrew won Bronze in the Australian U19 Board Riding Championship and Kevin Gillard won two Gold in the Masters. There are points to be gained in this section, particularly in the Long Board and Malibu Board sections; so, if you fancy yourself as a surfer why not get involved.

As mentioned earlier, the Beach section continues to grow and succeed under the guidance of coach Swanny. This season we defended our Queensland Beach Series title by comprehensively winning all three rounds of the series. Next minute our Beach section were recording our best ever result at Aussies! We have already started planning for 2023. There are opportunities to gain points in the 1km and 2km beach run / relays so if you can get involved.

Congratulations to Michael Brooks and the entire Boat section for not just competing at Aussies but for surviving. There were some extremely challenging conditions to contend with and with these conditions sometimes comes luck. After being in contention across a range of events we unfortunately didn't get the rub of the green and were knocked out. The U23s were able to memorably win another Australian Championship on the back of their win in 2021 (as U19s) with the 160 Yrs Male Surf Boat crew winning Bronze. Full details provided in Meggsy's Report.

Under the guidance of Lenore Grice OAM, Kylie McGrath and rookie Sarah McGrath, the Lifesaving Sport section once again recorded some outstanding results, including brother / sister team of Noah and Phoenix Wilson, winning Aussie Gold in U15 First Aid and Ruby Misso and Clover Youngman winning Gold in the U19 First Aid (as an U17 Team!).

This season I am proud to announce the introduction of the Lenore Grice OAM Lifesaving Sport Award to be awarded to the most outstanding Lifesaving Sport individual or team. Our club

is so very fortunate to have Lenore to coach our members in Lifesaving Sport events and to have Lenore available to influence and advise our members on their journey through the Club. Within Lifesaving Sport, we have some opportunities to improve in Patrol Competition and U23 March Past.

Glen and Clint bring a wealth of knowledge and experience to the program, which is the envy of all other clubs. Results speak for themselves and it is already evident that success will follow in coming seasons. Jake continues to be a favourite with the Nippers and delivers results whilst ensuring the kids are having a great time. With continued growth in competitor numbers, our coach / athlete ratio is too high and will need to be addressed in 2022-23.

One of the real strengths of our surf sports program is the array of volunteer coaches including Todd Grace, Lenore Grice OAM, David Lough, Tahlia McSwan, Kirk Jarrott and John Baxter to name just a few. Our program is in good hands. Our focus is to continue to build and invest in this program that ultimately will assist us to retain and attract members.

Aided by a host of new families eager to be a part of the Black Swan, and Jake Dales' continued development of our Junior program, we were big improvers this season. Maroochydore has fostered an all-inclusive atmosphere and reputation as the leading Club on the Sunshine Coast.

Disappointingly, we didn't get to race at the State Titles due to weather conditions. The team was primed, in what was shaping up as one of our strongest teams in recent years. Swanny has the Beach section absolutely firing and our Water section enjoyed strength in each age group.

The athletes who continued onto the Youth Aussies enjoyed exceptional gains on the previous year's performances. We were regularly in the top 6 and picked up 7 Gold, 8 Silver and 7 Bronze medals. Ruby (Twiggy) Williams (U13 Female Board), Sienna Carter (U13 Female 2km Run) and Stanley Jarrott (U13 Male 2km Swim) enjoyed individual Golds; outstanding performances and reward for hard work, sacrifice and discipline throughout the season.

Next season should see us continue in an upward trend with a strong group of U11s joining the competitive arena. The aim will be to win the Youth State Point Score – Bring on the challenge!

NUTRI-GRAIN

The senior athletes were back into training early, working hard and chasing their dream of Nutri Grain qualification. The athletes really put in the hard yards prior to the trial with Matt, Adam and Hayden all looking exceptionally strong on the first day of the trials. Adam and Hayden went on to qualify for their first full series, joining Tiarnee (auto qualified) on the big stage.

The boys battled with sickness and injury after the trial. This severely hampered their ability to hit peak performance in the series. This impediment did not cause them to shy away from the racing, taking all challenges head on, learning valuable lessons in preparation for next season. Tiarnee enjoyed mixed results, clearly showing she can take it to the best girls in the country. Opportunities presented themselves, lesson were learned, success and anguish of equal measure always present.

Tiarnee won the Summer of Surf Ironwoman at Alex, taking

home a handy 'pay check' in the process and once again proving that on her day she is hard to beat.

AUSSIES

What an Aussies! As mentioned, the Youth section made big gains amassing the amazing total of 22 medals.

The Seniors started off a little slow with plenty of 4ths (very frustrating), but as is often the way, it only takes one win to break the ice. On the Sunday, big Sam Harris broke through for his maiden Ironman title! After leading the Surf Race (then finished 3rd) the big fella was fired up to take out the Iron and that he did in a hard-fought victory.

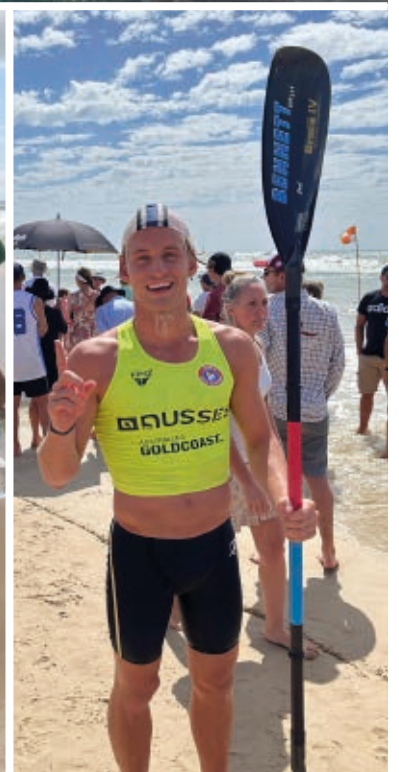
This victory got the crew going with U19 boys then taking out the Ski Relay and Oliver Monaghan breaking through to win the U19 Ironman in a race for the ages. Olly was on fire all week, full of confidence and hunger. Olly fought back through the field the entire race before hitting the apex (3rd leg) in equal first and through sheer grit and determination paddled away from his challenger in the gutter to take out the race! Joel Piper and Mitch Stitt backed up the performance finishing 3rd and 9th respectively. Maroochydore 3 Ironman athletes finished in the top 10.

The U19 boys then went on to claim victory in the Taplin Relay, backing up last year's performance. The U19 Age group had an outstanding Aussies with both the boys and girls performing exceptionally well.

Joel Piper took home a staggering 9 medals from the Australian Titles. This is the most medals any Maroochydore athlete has ever taken from a single Aussies! A just reward for his professionalism with a team that has come together to reap the rewards.

In total Maroochydore amassed a whopping 27 medals in the U17-Open category; this combined with our 22 Youth Medals and 5 Masters medals takes us to a grand total of 54 Australian Medals in 2021-22.

Results like this can only be achieved while everyone is pulling in one direction. Aussies is a direct result of this (one direction) happening over a sustained period. I'd like to congratulate everyone- athletes, coaches, management, support staff and sponsors for contributing to Maroochydore SLSC becoming an all-inclusive hub for young people to feel safe and thrive.

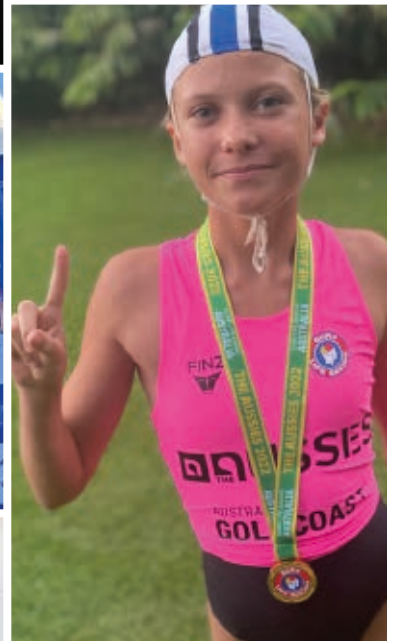
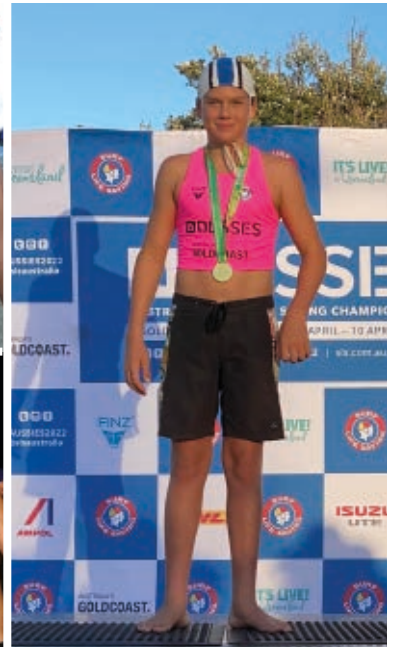

Team Manager's Report

It is pleasing to be writing this report on the back of another successful and enjoyable competition season for our club. Unfortunately, the season wasn't totally impact free, with Pool Rescue Championships being impacted by COVID restrictions and the State Championships being cancelled due to poor weather conditions. It has been another season where we have had to adjust and adapt, move through those disappointments, and focus on what we can control and do our best when we are competing. And I think it is clear our competitors have been able to do that with flying colours!

There has already been a lot covered in the Annual Report about our successes throughout the season, so I won't even try to call out individual competitors. However, the highlights below provide us with confidence that our team will continue to drive for success and is in great shape for the future:

- Ten of our athletes competed strongly at the Nutri-Grain qualifying trials at Tugun in December 2021 with Hayden Cotter and Adam Palmer qualifying for the Nutri-Grain Series. With Tiarnee Massie already qualified from the previous season, all three went on to represent Maroochydore strongly over six gruelling rounds;
- The Sunday of Aussies at North Kirra was a day to remember. It is finals days with over 25 finals taking place in two arenas over a relatively short period of time. It is a great achievement to make a final at Aussies and be representing your club on this day, and once again there were plenty of Black Swans ready to test themselves against the best in Australia. We started off strongly with the 'Maroochydore Black Swan' call from the commentators being heard often in both arenas. The day continued to build with plenty of Medal winning performances across all disciplines. The day culminating with a hard-fought Bronze Medal in an event that we had not won a medal in at Aussies for over 20 years, the 6 person Male Taplin;
- Competitive success is certainly one measure of progress, but it is also pleasing that the team continues to have strong numbers across all disciplines, whether it is the Beach, Boat or Surf competitors. We had over 190 competitors (Youth, Senior and Masters) at Aussies and over 120 teams competed for Maroochydore. This season we have also seen an influx of competitors from other clubs and the general feedback is that our strong coaching program is a key aspect of them joining our club;
- The inclusion of the Murphy Home Maroochydore Classic as part of the ever-growing Summer of Surf Series. The Summer of Surf Series continues to grow and bring innovation into Surf Sports by continuing to increase participation, competition, and excitement for all those involved in our carnival. In partnership with our own Murphy Homes Maroochydore Classic, we continue to build the sport and make it attractive to competitors and supporters; and

- Continued focus and support across all aspects of the Surf Sports competition disciplines including Beach, Surf, Boats, Surfing, Rescue events, First Aid, Pool Rescue and March Past.

In my third year in the Team Manager role, what continues to stand out and makes me appreciate being part of the team:

- The professionalism of our coaches, athletes and administration. The amount of work and commitment that goes into the team is incredible and is a credit to everyone involved;
- The willingness of people to help out and contribute – I would especially like to thank Lauren and Katherine in the Office, who are tireless in their support and hard work they deliver for the entire Surf Sports team. The list of others that are critical to manage the team includes Team Managers across all the disciplines, Officials, First Aid, IRB crews, handlers, people recording results or just the general willingness of people to jump in when a task needs to be done. Every carnival I attended this season there were at least two or three additional people offering to help in any way they could. This willingness was exemplified with the incredible work undertaken by a large number of members to support our team throughout the season. I would especially like to thank all those 'Assistant Team Managers' who were critical in managing the entire team across all disciplines. And that is not just one or two people, we have at least 15 members who were actively responsible for managing specific disciplines, age groups or administration for our Surf Sports team throughout the entire season; and
- The teamwork that is required to be successful - Maroochydore is a very competitive club with a long history of success. Individual success is certainly critically important to having a strong club and culture. However, the excitement and memories that are made when a Boat Crew, Beach Relay or Taplin Relay team work together to come out on top is infectious to be around. 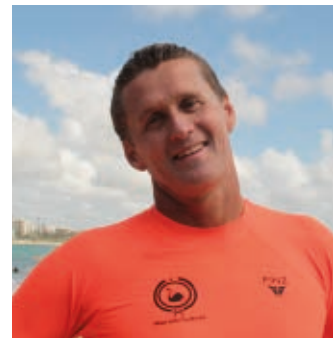

The challenge for the younger group is to retain them as club members and I think having Surfing as an included event at States & Aussies certainly helps with this, along with the Professional Surf Coaching provided by our long term sponsor Grant Thomas from Maroochy Surf School.

Having surfboard riding is assisting us with retaining patrolling members withing the Maroochydoore Club! It must also be noted that Surfers are generally the members who are surfing early before patrols start and late in afternoons when patrols have finished and these members like many free surfers perform lots of rescues on members of the public without acknowledgement. So, continuing to support Surfing within our Club and Lifesaving in general is vitally important.

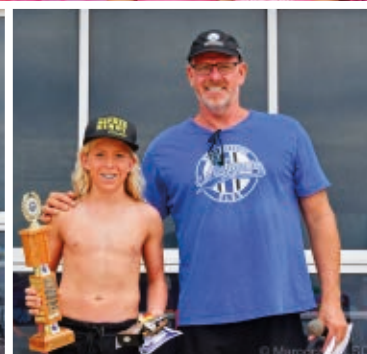

Board of Finance and Resources Report

Andrew Patrick, Director

After another year disrupted due to COVID, and more so one of the worst years with regards to weather that I can remember during my time here in the Club, it is with pleasure that I present this report on the financial status of the Club for the financial year ending 30 April 2022.

It is especially pleasing that all Boards within the Club have worked seamlessly to ensure our Club remains one of the most admired Surf Clubs on the coast, in a strong financial position, and maintaining a strong presence on the beach for both patrols and in competition.

This year the focus of the Board was to ensure there were funds available as required for each section of the Active side, maintaining a stable financial base for the Club, and considering external forces, reducing debt.

The financials are shown in the 2021-22 Annual Report.

The overall revenue of the Club has increased from the 2021 year, due mainly to the available grants that have been meticulously applied for by Kim Musgrove; and donations and fundraising, while in turn noting a significant reduction on government stimulus such as JobKeeper and cash flow boosts.

Rent continues to be paid in full from the Supporters' Club in line with the sub-lease agreement with the Supporter's Club.

Expenses increased as expected due to the reinstating of carnivals and event across the Board, as well as general day to day expenses due to the increase in activity back at the Club.

Overall, the Active Club incurred a loss in this financial year of \$262,220. This is an increase from the prior year loss of \$71,501. While depreciation contributes a large amount of this, \$247,142 employee expenses added to this, especially with the ceasing of the cash flow boost and JobKeeper, and has returned to normal level expected in line with pre-pandemic costs.

There was a slight increase in financing costs. However, this was due to the purchase of the vehicle in prior years where a full year's interest expense has been incurred, as well as the financing of the compulsory insurance for the Club. Apart from the motor vehicle loan, insurance arrangement and the QRIDA loan, the Club remains in a strong financial position. The loan to the Supporters' Club has also been reduced by another \$40,000 to sit at \$757,482 at the year's end.

At the year's end we had cash assets of \$224,527 down slightly from the prior year of \$334,435 taking into account the Westpac overdraft on the trading account (-\$48,065).

Our debtors and creditors continue to remain within terms, with a continued focus of repayment of accounts as early as possible to avoid any unnecessary late fees. Overall, our debt position remains satisfactory and with the continued reduction in debt puts us in a good position moving forward.

We have continued to provide new equipment for patrols and have also provided funds so that athletes can represent the Black Swan at a multitude of carnivals and events across Queensland and Australia.

Again, a big thank you goes to our Grants Officer, Kim Musgrove, for the tireless work he puts into securing any grant that we are eligible for. The latest being for the new SSV you would have seen just prior to the end of the patrol season.

Budgets for each of the Boards will be negotiated and finalised as soon as we are able to do so, bearing in mind the programmes planned for next season. With the depth of the athletes within the Club, we are expecting to expend significant funds in order to present a full and competitive team at all carnivals.

In conclusion, I have been advised by the Auditors who have finished their audit of our accounts that we meet all requirements of the ATO. For the year ending April 2022, as stated, we do not have a tax liability with the ATO.

I wish to thank all Board Members for their input and support during the last 12 months, the Finance Committee for its guidance, and the General Manager, Jack Orr, and look forward to continued success for the Club going forward.



Grants Officer's Report

Kim Musgrove

When reflecting on the Clubs' extraordinary success in grant applications it is good to also reflect on how our Grants Programme started many years ago. At that time, President Tim Ryan, asked me if I thought that the Club would benefit from such a venture, and I recall saying something like "well if we can secure \$500.00 then that's \$500.00 more than we had yesterday". Since then, we have far exceeded most expectations by well over 1000% and this year we have again been highly successful in gaining much needed and valued equipment to support our rescue operations, training and patrols for the parent club.

The most recent acquisition has been a new SSV which would normally cost \$25,680 for our patrol use and has already proved to be a great and timely asset supporting the club operations. This was made possible through the BRP grant which is a 50/50 grant valued at \$12,840.

Another significant grant was from the Beach Safety Equipment Fund which was for \$16,500 for a huge variety of eligible essential operation equipment for the club.

The Queensland State Government also supported the Club through the Queensland Fire and Emergency Services Grant of \$4,645 and yet another for the Queensland Regional Emergency Disaster Grant of \$10,000.

The Sunshine Regional Council again saw and recognised our club with the Youth and Future Leaders Development Grant of \$7,920 and another for the Volunteering Grant of \$2,200.

Dulux Australia also provided our Club with 100 litres of paint to refresh our Clubhouse.

At the time of writing this brief report, I can advise that we have submitted an application for Major and Significant Equipment with the Queensland Government, which if successful, would benefit us by \$100,000 for very important capital items. Naturally, you will be hearing about this should we be fortunate enough to be successful.

Annual Reports, by necessity, cause one to reflect on past performance and aids in identifying where a better outcome might be possible. It is also good to remember that we are One Club, Our Club and in this regard, I cannot help but think we have achieved a pretty remarkable outcome considering all the hurdles we have endured for the past two years. We have gone from a theoretical \$500 to over \$600,000 and when married to my previous efforts with the Club Markets, takes us well past the \$1M mark in fundraising for the Club, which is not too shabby by any standard.

I can now confess that I had intended to retire from the Grants Portfolio from this AGM but your Club President has requested that I continue on for some time to come and if at all possible better our constant and continued grant results for the members and Club. In this instance, I have agreed to do so given some changes are being implemented which would speed up our grant ordering, recording and processing protocols which in turn reflect straight back to giving the members what they need, and when they need it.

There are going to be some very significant challenges we will tackle in the next 5 or so years and now is the time to start planning on how to assist and offer service to that inevitable future, so I will be putting my hand up and lending a lot of energy in the future Club Development as well.
