Life Governors' Report Mal Pratt OAM Ralph Devlin AM KC

We are pleased to see that the mighty Black Swan once again had a great Season. Congratulations to all volunteers and staff who combined so well to make it all happen.

Club President Rob Elford completed his fourth season at the helm, ably supported by a skilled volunteer Board of Management and a diligent and skilled Surf Life Saving staff.

Rob also heads up the Maroochy Supporter's Club- a dual role which, though onerous, has served our members well for many years now. Supporter's Club Manager Tim Wagner leads an unfailingly courteous and hard-working staff.

SURF PATROLS - NO LIVES LOST

Surf Patrols have presented very well throughout the season. Some difficult surf conditions have led to several very dicey and meritorious rescues, which are described elsewhere in this Annual Report. Patrol efficiency is directly related to the diligence and dedication of the Teams led by Club Captain Drew Moles, aided by his excellent Patrol Captains, and by the Training and Assessment Team led by Chief Training Officer Michelle Burnett and her Trainers and Assessors.

Well done to all of our other volunteers, including Radio Officers/Observers and First Aid Officers.

THE SURF CLUB REBUILD PROJECT

You will all know by now that the Building and Works Committee, led by Life Member Laurie Murphy, are welladvanced in the Approvals stage of our Surf Clubhouse rebuild. Laurie's Committee is an impressive collection of suitably qualified volunteers (Planning, Construction, Local Government, Law) as well as expert paid professionals. The Board of Management is across all major developments, and they continue to be constructive in their approach to this important and complex endeavour.

The Life Governors are active in this space because we both realise how important this Project is for future generations of our Maroochydore Lifesavers.

SURF SPORTS

Early highlights in the season include a very successful 'Murphy Builders Classic', at which Tiarnee Massie won the Ironwoman on her home beach and Sam Short the Open Surf Race. There were many other highlights, but it is fair to say that, almost 60 years on, our reputation for putting on the big surf carnivals remains intact. Congratulations in particular to Darren 'Spot' Kerr, Director of Marketing and Promotions, and his Team. Wade Lee continues to lead in the 'Carnival Organiser' role.

Another Surf Sports highlight was the 'clean sweep' of State First Aid Championships under Coach Lenore Grice OAM. It is a while since we won all State First Aid Championship events from Opens to Under 15s. At Aussies, all Maroochydore First Aid Teams made the podium! Jolly well done to you all!

Yet another highlight was our Surf Sports Team pushing the State Championships pointscore to within 13 points of the perennial winners, Northcliffe. Maroochydore's performance across all disciplines recalled, for your Life Governors, the 'glory days' of the 1990s and 2000s. Head Coach Nathan 'Bugsy' Greig and his Team, and Surf Sports Director Danny Short and his Team- well played! Don't let us forget the Boats under Michael 'Megsy' Brooks and Corey Stone. We are so pleased to see your crews doing well.

So also our magnificent 'Beachies' under Coach Todd 'Swanny' McSwan and his Manager Assistant, MJ Holmes and Memphis Shield, as well as many committed parents. And to our athletes - You do us proud with your fierce but sporting competitiveness in a tough part of our Sport.

Meanwhile, our Youth Team scored a creditable and narrow third placing at 'Nipper States'. But they went on to top the (unofficial) Australian Youth Championships pointscore by a large margin. Again, congratulations to Director Jay Whatley and his hard-working Team of parents, Age Managers and Coaches. Not to mention our wonderful kids!

THE 2024 AUSSIES

We have farewelled other Senior members who are listed elsewhere. But to think that we lost our three Life Members in a week in August 2023 is truly sad and extraordinary.

And we warmly acknowledge the way our Life Members and

Senior Members and Past Members supported each other at each of this season's send-offs of our Departed. This is the Black Swan spirit at work- #Loyalty, Guts and Glory.

THE LIFE MEMBER NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

This season we wish to recognise the good work of Glynn Topfer OAM in his painstaking research conducted for the Committee. We the Life Governors believe that this thorough Committee process, supported by Glynn's work, where no one is overlooked, upholds the 'Institution' of Life Membership in our great Club.

We now have elected just over 100 Life Members, since 1940, and our cohort of living Life Members is steady at 65.

THE CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE

This Committee also plays an important role in the

Governance of our Club. Their work output has been intense this season. Thanks to regular contributors- Narelle Souter, Paul O'Brien, Glynn Topfer OAM, Brett Williamson OAM and Secretary Kirk Williamson. The Life Governors recognise your excellent work in this area.

THE FUTURE

The Black Swan continues to enjoy the respect and admiration of our Association throughout Australia. We must never take this for granted. Teamwork, dedication and respect for each other is what keeps our 'show' afloat, year after year. The Life Governors receive many compliments about our great Club from around our Sunshine Coast community and from around Australia. You all play your part in upholding our great traditions which now stretch back 108 years.





Life Member Clint 'Matey' Irwin

Clint joined Maroochydore from Noosa Heads SLSC as a Junior on 10 October 1991. He was granted Long Service membership in July 2000.

Clint holds a total of 64 SLSA Awards.

Across the 25 years from 1991 'Matey' Irwin has distinguished himself as one of our most durable Surf Sports athletes. Along the way Clint has received Club awards that tell us that within the twin arenas of Surf Lifesaving and Surf Sports, Clint has been a leader without peer. These are the Club awards over the years:

- 1993-94: Fay Nixon Trophy- Most Improved Competitor,
- 1996-97: Mattingley & Gatehouse Trophy Most Outstanding Competitive Team,
- 1999-2000: Ken Neil Trophy- Most Outstanding Patrol Person,
- 2005-06: Alex Devlin Memorial Most Outstanding Masters Competitor,
- 2007-08: Alex Devlin Memorial Trophy.

That's five Club Awards in fourteen seasons- a good strike rate.

Now let's double-back to his Open and Masters Aussies record:

- Taplin member 1994-2005, occupying every place in the Open Australian Taplin Relay Championship Final of 1st to 6th. 1997 Open Taplin Relay 1st,
- 2002 Open Board Relay- 1st,
- Aussies Open Podium finishes, mainly in Taplin, Board & Board Relay events 5,
- Masters Aussies 2006 to 2023- 15 Gold, 5 Silver, 2 Bronze.

By 2006-07 Season until 2011, Clint's leadership began to be reflected in another way; for five Seasons he was a member of the Board of Surf Sports as Ironman Captain.

In Season 2013-14 Clint was awarded the SLSA 25-year Service Award.

In Season 2021-22 Clint was awarded the SLSA 30-year Service Award.

Now we see another significant development of Clint's commitment to Club leadership and loyalty: in 2015-16 Season, our Centenary Season, Clint began a long stint as a 'Nipper Dad', taking on the role of Under 8s Manager on the Board of Junior Activities, all the way through to Under 15's this year.

In 2019-20 Clint was appointed Coaching Co-ordinator on the Board of Junior Activities. Four years later, with his eldest, Harry, reaching the oldest Nipper Age Group, Clint remains a very positive leader and role model in Nippers - immensely knowledgeable, good-humoured, a living example of Black Swan 'loyalty, guts and glory'.

Clint is currently assisting Maroochydore's Building & Works Committee with our 'Towards 2032' Clubhouse rebuilding plans. Clint is a senior member with multiple athletic and professional skills which he gives freely to the Black Swan.

With such a fine athletic record and record of conspicuous and loyal service on all fronts, Clint 'Matey' Irwin is a standout candidate for election as Maroochydore's 97th Life Member.



Life Member Nathan 'Bugsy' Greig

'Bugsy' joined Maroochydore Nippers in 1988 and gained his Bronze Medallion on 20 November 1994.

Nathan holds 86 SLSA Awards.

Bugsy enjoyed a distinguished career in Surf Life Saving competition for 13 Seasons until 2000-01. Podium finishes in Aussies Surf Teams racing were the highlight. As an age swimmer Bugsy regularly competed in Open Surf Teams, the indicator of toughness in a tough event.

In this period Bugsy won the following Awards:

- Mattingley & Gatehouse Trophy Most Outstanding Competitive Team- Under 16 Surf Teams
- Stretton Memorial Trophy- Most Efficient Patrol
- Silver Medal- International Year of the Volunteer
- 10 year patrol award, 2004-05

As a Coach in Surf Life Saving Bugsy has excelled, rising to prominence Nationally and Internationally.

2006-07 to 2011-12: Club Nipper Coach

2007-08 to 2008-09: Sunshine Coast Branch Nippers Team Coach

2018-19 to 2019-20: Sunshine Coast Branch Open Team Coach

In 2011 Maroochydore Cygnets missed the State Nipper Championship by 1 point to Northcliffe but reversed that result on our own beach in March 2012 - a tribute to the developing coaching skills of Nathan Greig.

In the 2012-13 season, 'Bugsy' assumed the position of Senior Club Coaching Coordinator (later called Head Coach), a position he has carried out with distinction for 11 consecutive seasons so far.

In those 11 seasons, one of many highlights was the crowning of Maroochydore SLSC as the World Youth Champions in 2018. In the same year Maroochydore was Champion Club in the Under 17 Age Group at the Perth Aussies. Again, a pointer to excellence in Bugsy's coaching skills.

A further amazing statistic: in Bugsy's 10 Aussies as Head Coach of the Senior Club from 2012-13 until 2022-23, Maroochydore has won 117 Australian Championships across all disciplines - an average of 12 Australian Championships per Season!

In the 2017-18 season Bugsy was voted Queensland Coach of the Year.

In the 2018-19 season Bugsy was awarded his SLSA 20-year coaching Certificate and 25-year Long Service Award.

Bugsy's attention to athlete welfare means that as a Nipper and Senior Coach he has always gone 'over and above'. He has been a fine ambassador and role model to the generations of our youth. As a professional coach his performance has been outstanding. His loyalty and example as a true Black Swan is the factor that qualifies Nathan 'Bugsy' Greig for nomination for election as Maroochydore's 98th Life Member.



Life Member Fran (Frances) Boulton

Fran joined Maroochydore SLSC, with her husband Paul, on 18 October 2000, having been involved in Surf Lifesaving in Sydney. Almost immediately Fran set about making a significant contribution to the Black Swan, especially in Club administration, around our Marketing, Fundraising and Social activities. That contribution continues 23 years later.

In 2000-01 season Fran joined the March Past team and was a reliable member for the next 6 Seasons.

In 2005-06 Fran began a stint of 7 years as an ordinary member of the Board of Marketing and Promotion. She also became part of a very active Social Committee, a compatible role to Marketing and Promotion. Fran worked alongside folk such as Life Member Ann Dunn.

In 2008 Fran led a small group of our Youth Leaders (including a young Alyce Burnett and a young Kirra Dale) to meet the Queensland Governor, Dame Quentin Bryce, at Government House in Brisbane. This demonstrated Fran's commitment to and belief in our young lifesavers.

In 2011 Fran and husband Paul joined President Tim Ryan's large band of workers from the Club who travelled to Ipswich to help with the Brisbane Floods clean-up. This kind of volunteering has typified Fran's 23-year contribution to our club and to the community generally.

In 2012-13 Fran commenced as Director of Marketing and Promotions and was therefore a member of the Board of Management of the club; she retired from the Director position in 2017 after serving five years on the Board of Management of Maroochydore SLSC.

In the 2013-14 season, for example, Fran as Director of Marketing and Promotions, and her Team, oversaw no less than 6 major fundraising social and sporting events:

- Boaties Dinner (May)
- Sports Lunch (July)
- Corbould Park Race Day (August)
- Westpac/A Mart/Rebel Nipper Carnival (November)
- Murphy Builders Carnival (January)
- Surf Girl Golf Day (January)

These of course were annual events held over the last 20 years, with Fran playing an integral part. This level of consistent commitment has therefore been a way of life for Fran year-in, year-out, for the better part of those 20 years.

In 2014-15 we added to that list of events, the Queensland Youth and Open Championships and International Surf Rescue Challenge, all of which required the strong support of Fran's team and then straight on to hosting the 2016 Aussies, with all its complexity.

In the 2016-17 season Fran was awarded the JFH ('Fred') Murray Trophy for 'Best Masters Club Person'.

Over this period Fran helped arrange and run, other memorable Club activities:

• 2004 'Centurions' Dinner, celebrating our first 100 Australian Surf Life Saving Champions. Fran was intimately involved in the planning and execution of the dinner and celebrations.

- Annual Surf Girl events (now called 'Women of Surf'), eg the Golf Day each January. Fran played a leading organising role in the 'Surf Girl' fundraising and social events, collecting money, welcoming golfers, and generally working in a team to deliver these events.
- Annual Sports Luncheons each July; these Luncheons used to be conducted at least annually where Fran would meet and greet, look after the money, and generally play a significant role in the delivery of the event.
- Annual Race Days at Courbold Park each August; hosting and organising fundraising.
- General Club Golf Days held each August; registering golfers, marshalling prizes and hosting.
- Annual \$10,000 Draw each December; sale of 250 x \$100 tickets and hosting on the day of the draw, a very well-attend event, especially when the prawns were on.
- Annual Shimoda Club (Japan) visits; catering meals and hosting social events for our Shimoda friends each December to January.
- Annual 'A-Mart' Nipper Carnival; catering and merchandise stalls.
- Annual 'Murphy Homes' Open Carnival; catering and merchandise stalls.
- State Nipper Championships; catering and merchandise 2012 & 2015 (the latter was the inaugural 'Youth' Championships).
- State Open Championships; catering and merchandise 2012 & 2015.
- Australian Championships; hosting and merchandise 2016 & 2021.
- Assisting Ralph Devlin and Peter Rigby with a range of Centenary Book Committee reunion events held in our Centenary season of 2015-16.
- Assisting the Centenary Committee with the Centenary Dinner, June 2016.

In the 2019-20 season Fran was a member of the Board of Finance and Resources.

In the two seasons 2020-22 Fran was a member of 2 Surf Club Boards:*

- The Board of Finance and Resources (as 'Finance Officer') and
- The Board of Marketing and Promotions (as 'Events Officer').

In the 2022-23 season, Fran continued as Finance Officer, Board of Finance & Resources.

To be such a constant presence in virtually all major Club social and fundraising events over the last 22 years, and to have served in formal positions within the Maroochydore Surf Club Board structure across 15 of those years, marks Fran Boulton as a worthy candidate for election as our 99th Life Member.



Life Member Patrick Lafferty

Patrick joined Maroochydore as a Nipper in 1990s. He gained his Bronze Medallion on 26 September 2003 and was granted Long Service Membership in 2013. He is the son of a Life Member- Mick Lafferty.

Patrick holds 67 SLSA Awards.

Patrick's outstanding contributions to Maroochydore SLSC over all the last 20 years can be summed up this way:

- Our most successful First Aid competitor and that is saying something, given we are the most successful club in Australia in this exacting discipline!
- Our most awarded active member- five Club Awards in eight years!
- Patrol Captain for 8 years and patrolling member for 15 years,
- A key member of the Australian Championships First Aid Group since 2013- 10 years of donating his professional skills to SLSA, proudly representing Maroochydore SLSC.

How is this for a competitive record at Aussies, bearing in mind the First Aid Teams back in the day had to win or be runner-up to progress automatically from Branch to State to Aussies:

- 2003-04: Under 16 First Aid Championship of Australia, 1st
- 2004-05: Under 19 & Under 16 First Aid Championships of Australia, 1st
- 2005-06: Under 19 & Under 17 First Aid Championships of Australia, 1st
- 2010-11: Open First Aid Championship of Australia, 1st

For those six gold medals, Patrick teamed with Felicity O'Connor (U16- U19) and with Life Member Fiona Meredith (Open). And yes, Patrick won Gold in every available age group, twice winning double Gold.

In and around Maroochydore's First Aid competition team, from about 2007 to 2012 Patrick was a mentor and junior coach under Lenore Grice's leadership and also served as a First Aid competition official when he wasn't competing in his own events. It's hardly surprising then that Patrick won five Club Awards in eight years:

- 2003-04: Brian Davey Shield- Best Cadet Club
- 2004-05: Ken Neil Trophy Most Outstanding Junior Patrol Person
- 2005-06: Mattingley & Gatehouse Trophy Most Outstanding Competitive Team
- 2008-09: Fiona Simpson Trophy- Most Patrol Hours
- 2010-11: Mattingley & Gatehouse Trophy Most Outstanding Competitive Team

In 2006-07 Patrick commenced as a Patrol Vice Captain.

From 2007-08 to 2014-15 Seasons Patrick performed the duties of Patrol Captain.

In 2017-18 Patrick received the SLSA 15 year Patrol Service Award.

In 2019-20 Patrick received the SLSA 15 year Officiating Award.

That is a unique 'double' in Patrolling and Officiating for such a young person.

Immediately upon his retirement from competition in 2012 Patrick donated his skills as a Paramedic in the Queensland Ambulance Service each year to SLSA and has been deployed at the Aussies ever since, proudly representing Maroochydore SLSC in the Medical Workforce. Each year Patrick takes his Recreation Leave of 10 days to render this Volunteer Service. 2023 will mark Patrick's 10 years in this important role.

For 20 years Patrick Lafferty has rendered conspicuous service to Maroochydore SLSC - as Champion, as Patrol Captain, as First Aid Competition Coach and Official and as a humble "actual' First Aid Team Volunteer at Aussies for a decade - an accolade worthy of nomination for election as our 100th Life Member.



Life Member Amanda Massie

Amanda joined Maroochydore SLSC in September 2003 and gained her Bronze Medallion on 14 December 2003. She was awarded Long Service Membership in 2013. Amanda holds 79 SLSA Awards, including the esteemed National Medal which she attained this season. This award acknowledges her outstanding patrol service over a period of 15 years.

Amanda was 'away to a flyer' when, in just her second season, 2004-05, she won two prestigious Club Service Awards:

- Terry Lane Memorial- Most Efficient Patrol
- Ruth Williamson Memorial Most Outstanding Female Member

By the 2006-07 season, Amanda was Deputy Chief Training Officer and, of course won the Vic Murphy Trainer of the Year.

Amanda continued as a committed Trainer and Assessor at Maroochydore for the next 16 seasons.

Meanwhile, Amanda pursued Masters competition over six seasons, with a highlight being the 2008 World Masters Championships in Warneminde, Germany, where she won Gold, Silver and Bronze medals in Masters team events.

In the 2008-09 season Amanda again won the Ruth Williamson Award for Most Outstanding Female Member. In that season she managed the Club's Development Tour to USA.

In 2009-10, Amanda began a long stint as a Patrol Captain, a role she still discharges today, 14 years later.

In 2013-14, Amanda gained her 10-year patrol service award.

In 2015-16, Amanda was appointed as an Ordinary Member of the Board of Surf Life Saving and remains on that board as First Aid Officer.

In 2016-17, Amanda completed 10 years as an Assessor, again, a role she still performs in 2022-23.

In 2017-18, Amanda gained her 15-year patrol service award.

In the period 2017 to 2021, Amanda volunteered her time as Manager of the Sunshine Coast Branch Surf Team during most of those years.

Another notable contribution to Maroochydore SLSC is Amanda's reliable contribution to the much-needed First Aid Team at every surf carnival hosted by Maroochydore SLSC. This is an often-onerous role which Amanda has carried out for many years with conspicuous efficiency.

In 2019-20, Amanda marked 15 years as a Trainer and Assessor.

During all of the 20 years covered by this citation, Amanda has raised her two daughters with husband Dale - already a Life Member. Brianna and Tiarnee are each distinguished multiple Australian Champions for Maroochydore. The sisters hold a staggering 16 Australian Championships between them. And we all appreciate the effort required from Surf Life Saving parents over many seasons of arduous competition.

No-one could have given more, over 20 years, to the important work of Maroochydore SLSC. Amanda Massie is honoured with the recommendation for election as our 101st Life Member.





President's Report Rob Elford

My report this year will begin with the proud claim that for the 108th season there have been no lives lost between the flags on Maroochydore beach. An opening statement that I hope every future report can be proud to claim. Our core business is and will always be Lifesaving, safeguarding the community and visitors to our beach.

Our great club's foundations were put in place and although the world has changed (dramatically), I still believe that the core of what we do and who we are when we make the choice to serve others, shows the humanity in us all. It is no easy task to manage the Lifesaving section of a huge club with over 300 Active members, to train, roster and ensure every Patrol meets our patrol obligations.

To Drew Moles (Director of Lifesaving), every Patrol Captain and indeed every patrolling member you have our gratitude.

Our Trainers led by our CTO Michelle Burnett who have once again this season trained so many future Lifesavers; thank you. We do not continue to exist if we do not have new members gaining their Bronze Medallions, Surf Rescue Certificates, First Aid and Radio awards, IRB qualifications, Water Safety and the many other awards that are necessary to keep our bathing community safe.

This season, over 300 Active members took part in patrolling our beach and safeguarded more than 90,000 visitors on our beach.

Our Junior Activities numbers remain strong with over 300 young souls beginning their journey in Lifesaving and hopefully our great club. To see so many of the youth that I was lucky enough to know and watch grow into adulthood return to the Club with their children is heartwarming to say the least. The decision by every parent who enrols their child in a Lifesaving Club is one that they will thank you for when they are old enough to appreciate what they have gained and the life skills they have been taught.

Every Sunday throughout the season, you cannot be unmoved. Watching the next generations going through their paces, beginning a journey for some that will be the making of lifelong friends and being part of one of the most iconic Surf Clubs in history.

Our Nipper program does and cannot exist but for the efforts of so many dedicated volunteers.

Our history of being a Surf Sports icon remains well intact with so many of our members excelling in the Surf Sports and other arenas.

Running two successful Club carnivals the Century 21 on Duporth Junior Carnival and the Murphy Homes Maroochy Classic, which is now part of the Summer of Surf Series. As a Club we continue to run and impress all those who attend our carnivals; but they only see the finished product. The countless hours of administration and organisation that is required pre and post event is a credit to all involved. The support of our valued sponsors in Surf Sport and Lifesaving makes it possible for the Club to ensure we have the resources to carry out our core business and remain an icon in the sports arena.

With Aussies back on our own beach this season, we showed the rest of Australia and the world that we are a power in Surf Sports that keeps on improving and astounding those clubs that chose a different path to gain success. I believe our success comes from our depth and that so many of our great athletes can claim with pride that they have been members at Maroochydore since they began their Lifesaving journeys, many since Green Caps. Belonging to a Club that has stood the test of time, that is recognised worldwide and whose history, as is its future, are determined by the contributions of so many who chose to be part of a family, a Club and community.

Our Youth at Aussies were unofficially 1st by a considerable margin and the Seniors 3rd overall. An amazing effort and credit to our coaching staff led by Nathan Greig (Bugsy). The most gratifying aspect with our results was that they were achieved in every arena with all contributing to the result.

The Clubs efforts in running the Aussies was much appreciated and acknowledged by SLSA President John Baker and the Organising Committee who once again were impressed with the Club's ability to host with the other Clubs a successful event. With approximately 8,300 entries it is agreed that it was the largest Aussies in history.

The Supporters' Club continues to trade well setting, new benchmarks and increasing its financial support to the Active Club. Our Supporters' Club Manager Tim Wagner has shown himself to be an asset, with himself and his team continuing to improve their performance and value to the Club. Our ageing building is being nursed toward our proposed rebuild and all credit to Tim and the Supporters Board for their efforts in maintaining such high standards in service and ongoing maintenance.

Our new Club journey is progressing well with most key requirements being ticked off on the way to approvals being granted. I can't speak highly enough of Laurie Murphy (Chair of the Building and Works Committee) and the time and guidance he has bought to the project. There are so many individuals involved in all aspects of our New Build, but it would be remiss of me not to acknowledge the input of Dale Massie, Clint Irwin, and Mal Pratt in the planning stage of our journey.

The planning, fundraising and relocation during the rebuild are massive undertakings which we will all need to be part of the many groups that are working through these aspects of the rebuild. Kim Musgrove has once again been our Grants guru, sourcing over \$175,000 in vital funds that have been used to improve our equipment and facilities. Well done Kim; don't ever leave.

Our Administration staff have again been the fabric that holds the Club together, their countless hours over and above their paid roles which are unseen by most, ensures that the Club continues to adhere to all administration guidelines and requirements for the Club to exist. We are fortunate that our staff are not only employees but volunteers who are vested in the Club through their families and friends.

I am deeply appreciative of the commitment of the Board of Management and the Supporters' Committee without whose guidance and input the Club would not continue to be a force in lifesaving, sport and business.

Volunteering your time and energy to be a productive and caring member of Lifesaving and our Club family is inherent in everyone that chooses to wear a patrol cap, volunteers and chooses to give back to our community by safeguarding those who visit our beach. Not every member patrols the beach, but their contribution is still essential to the overall operation and existence of our Great Club.

My hope for our immediate future is that you will not wait to be asked but step forward and be part of our mission to serve, safeguard and guide our future and to leave a legacy for future generations.





Building and Works Committee Report Laurie Murphy, Chair

This report is new to the Annual Reporting of the Club, and that is due to the timing and significance of the Club's Vision moving forward. In September 2021, the Board of Management appointed a group of people to look into the future, and arrive at, what would be acceptable facilities for our Club in the years ahead. The Building and Works Committee (BWC) was formed and has been working ever since on the project. At the AGM of 2022, it was unanimously voted by the membership to proceed with the application of approvals for the proposal of demolishing our current clubhouse and rebuilding a facility which recognises the requirements of the volunteering membership to keep our beach safe into the years ahead.

Since this time, the BWC has been engaged at all levels of Government, as the application for the extension to our lease boundary, and the approval of our concept, is through a State Government process. The BWC have held many meetings with all relevant authorities.

The BWC has also spent many hours in high level design, arranging professional reports and conducting surveys for the application. The focus of the BWC is for the volunteering lifesaving Club Members to have a facility which is second to none in the country. The plans will not increase the square meterage of the Supporters' Club at all. That is not to detract from the wonderful contribution of the Supporters Club, but our vision is all about lifesaving. I am pleased to advise that our plans see the lifesaving Club go from the current area of 1,116 square metres to 4,760 square metres. As this report goes to print, the detailed application is now complete, in line with the Government requirements. It will now need to be approved by the Minister.

The next steps are, that upon approval, we will be engaging with all stakeholders to commence the process of detailed design of the internals of the facility. We have already done community engagement, but this will be an ongoing obligation. We are also extremely focussed on fund raising and have a multifaceted income plan. We would ask that every Member become engaged in the project at all levels, and we think that fund raising might be an easy place to start. Just email the Club or speak to Darren Kerr.

In closing, we would invite all Members no matter what your role, to be part of this vision. We see it as our obligation to our Green Caps, as well as the current membership and a legacy, which will ensure volunteer lifesaving into the next generation.

2023 saw the relaunch of our Shimoda Program after a three year pause due to Covid.

That time wasn't wasted with Peter Dun and Mike Dwyer undertaking two years or research to collate and publish the history of the program from its conception by Mal Pratt and Ako Hisamatsu in 1993, the official signing of the agreement in 1998, and through to its 25th Anniversary in December 2023. As part of reaching this milestone, Peter also hosted a 25th Anniversary Dinner in the Black Swan Room attended by dignitaries from Japan and Australian lifesaving together with many Maroochydore and Shimoda members who have participated in the program over the years.

AJF Grants Manager Maria Guazon attended the anniversary reflecting their great interest and support of the program. It was a great evening and reunion enjoyed by all. Funding for both the history publication and the 25th Anniversary Dinner was provided through grants from Australia Japan Foundation (AJF) within the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT), who have been great supporters of the program from time to time over the years.

At the June Annual General Meeting, Peter Dun stood down from the role of Program Coordinator after 20 years in the program and 15 years as Coordinator. Wade Lee was elected to the role, with great opportunities already underway from Wade and his team for 2024 and beyond.

A small Maroochydore team of two travelled to Shimoda in August 2023. Ruben Zikarsky and Todd Grace enjoyed a

wonderful stay at Shimoda beaches, training and patrolling with the Shimoda members conduction coaching sessions, and enjoying the cultural immersion. With the program back underway, Maroochydore is hoping to send four to six members to Shimoda in August 2024, who are being selected through an Expression of Interest process.

The December program also recommenced this year where ten Shimoda Club members lived in at Maroochydore Club to participate in a Surf Sports coaching program, plus sightseeing and a variety of Australian experiences. Coach Shu Miyabe and Shimoda President Satoshi Yamaguchi also participated throughout and represented Shimoda at the 25th Anniversary Dinner. The December program was a great success with many fresh faces from Maroochydore becoming involved and building a solid platform going forward. The program had great support from new and previous coaches, and significant enthusiastic involvement from Maroochydore Youth group.

The Shimoda Committee would like to acknowledge and thank the Presidents and Boards of Management for their support of the program over the past 25 years. Congratulations to all our patrolling members for their admirable efforts. There were some notably rescues during the season, and these are described elsewhere in the Annual Report.

Maroochydore SLSC has continued to uphold the proud tradition of 'no lives lost between the flags' for 108 seasons. Members understand the importance of 'Vigilance and Service', and how rescues can be avoided through early interventions and preventative actions. This is a remarkable achievement which every member and supporter should find very satisfying. The development of a Club culture that embraces service to the community through active voluntarism should be a strategic aspiration.

All athletes, managers, coaches, and supporters should be congratulated for their outstanding efforts, helping Maroochydore SLSC attain results amongst the top three clubs in Australia. Loyalty to the Club and fellow competitors was displayed by the athletes who competed in a full range of events, making it a real team effort.

Our U14 and U15 members, along with their older mentors, participated in Youth Development and Training programs during the season. These included the Youth Excellence Program (YEP), Leadership Excellence Program (LEP) and the Advanced Lifesaving Program (PULSE). These programs provide valuable pathways for members developing leadership skills within a Surf Life Saving context.

Furthermore, many of our Youth members registered for Camp Commando. It is programs like Camp Commando that help to upskill our younger members' teamwork and leadership skills, which are so essential for our Club's future.

My sincere thanks to the Youth Development Officer, Natalie Jarrott, who has provided valuable assistance throughout the season in her critical role. More detailed information is outlined in her accompanying report.

Strength in membership is important for the long-term viability of Maroochydore SLSC in meeting its key objectives. Key data as described in the SLSQ Membership Statistical Reports include:

- Membership levels as shown by the combination of Cadet, Active Junior, Active Senior, Award Members and Reserve Active Members can be seen as an indicator of the patrolling strength of the Club. For the 2023-24 season so far, Active patrolling membership totals 329, which is historically quite high.
- The overall retention rate of 74% for all membership categories is considered by SLSQ to be quite a good rate.
- Transfer statistics cover all categories of membership, and in 2023-24 they show an overall net loss for the Club of 16 members. This follows a real surge in transfers to Maroochydore in recent years.
- It is interesting to note the overall breakdown of female/ male membership for our Club is 43:57, whereas for both Youth and Nipper members they are close to 50:50. The difference is that males significantly outnumber females in the Masters/Open category.
- There were a record number of 128 Cadets and Junior patrolling members in these age groups compared with the past nine seasons. These high numbers are generated directly from successful Junior Activities programs with the emphasis on enjoyment, safety and the development of skills, which are greatly supported by excellent coaching programs.
- Associate membership currently stands at 192, of which over 90% of these members are Nipper parents.
- The number of Active Senior members reached 172, which is amongst the highest levels for the past nine years. Strong Surf Sports and Education/Training programs underpin the higher retention rates, which has increased the overall number of members.
- Long Service membership reached a high level of 98 during the season, and many of these members have not really 'retired', so to speak, but are continuing to contribute to the management of the Club as well as patrols, competing in Surf Sports, and training others.
- The Chief Training Officer, Michelle Burnett, and her skilful and supportive team are to be congratulated for their training of Active members across the full range of Awards, as well as the substantial number of Skills Maintenance sessions. All these programs continue to contribute to the increased skill sets of patrolling members.
- Trends in the medium to long-term suggest that membership levels for the Club seem to be generated directly from the large number of younger members. This is clearly the consequence of wide-spread parental support and the excellent programs in the Junior age groups, especially the quality of the coaching which they are privileged to receive.

BLUE CARD INFORMATION

Surf Life Saving is Australia's largest youth movement. It is wellrecognised that the organisation's biggest risk is potential harm to children in our care.

During the season you may be aware that some members were reminded that they needed to renew their Blue Cards, which were not current at the time. Assistance was offered by the administration staff to these members to enable them to meet this mandatory SLSQ requirement.

Subsequently, in some cases where the deadline for renewal of Blue Cards was not met, their membership statuses were

changed to leave/restricted, which unfortunately prevents them from participating in all club activities. This report provides a timely opportunity to outline important information regarding Blue Card requirements.

Accordingly, SLSQ has invested in significant resources to support clubs in Child and Youth Risk Management (CYRM) strategies through the provision of information. However, responsibility for child and youth risk management fundamentally rests with individuals and their clubs.

As required under the current State Legislation and SLSQ policies, Maroochydore SLSC has undertaken the following as a matter of priority:

- All current Office-bearers were listed in Surfguard (as required under the Affiliation Agreement).
- All members of the current Junior Activities Committee have also been listed in Surfguard.
- Completed the Patrol Gap Calculator which will identify any patrolling members without current Blue Cards and/or have not completed Child/ Youth Risk Management (CYRM) and Child Safe Awareness (CSA) on-line courses.
- Child Safety is a Standing item on the agenda of the Board of Management (BOM)meetings. The corrective actions of members, who do not have current Blue Cards are recorded in BOM Minutes.

CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE

The current Constitution Committee consists of Kirk Williamson (Chair), Brett Williamson, Glynn Topfer, Narelle Souter, and Paul O'Brien. I congratulate every member of the Committee for their dedication to the task.

Over the past year or so, they have used their considerable expertise and experience to undertake a full review of the Maroochydore SLSC Inc. Constitution, with members of the Committee working very diligently in the process over an extended period.

There were times when there was healthy debate over issues, and this along with the consultation with Members, has helped to produce a draft Club Constitution which meets our current governance requirements of our Club.

The purpose of the consultations sessions with Members was to receive and provide feedback, including key amendments and/ or additions to the draft documents, and share further ideas for their consideration.

The final stage for the creation of the new Club Constitution is fast approaching. The definitive version of the Club Constitution, which was endorsed by the Board of Management will now be presented to Club Council for their consideration at the 2024 Annual General Meeting.

Special thanks to the diligent staff in the Lifesaving Office, especially the Lifesaving Administrators, Katherine, Georgia and Emily, for the important role they continue to perform admirably for the Club.

I would like to take this opportunity to record my sincere thanks to the President, Rob Elford, for the support, leadership, and guidance he gave to the Board of Management, and ultimately, our Club. Special thanks also to all other Directors and Officers in the Club for their on-going commitment to ensuring Maroochydore SLSC continues to succeed across all facets of Club business.

Finally, but not least, I thank the Sunshine Coast community, carnival sponsors and donors, especially the Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Supporters' Club, for their generous and on-going support.



Youth Development Report Natalie Jarrott

As the Youth Officer for the Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club (MSLSC) for the 2023-24 season, I am pleased to present this report outlining the various initiatives and activities that have been implemented to support the Youth Members of our club.

2023-24 YOUTH NUMBERS

1. SLSQ AND SLSA LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS

Maroochydore has supported the participation of our Youth Members in the Surf Life Saving Queensland (SLSQ) and Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) leadership programs. These programs provide wonderful opportunities for our young members to develop their leadership skills, learn about surf lifesaving-operations, and engage with other young lifesavers from across the state and country.

PULSE JUNIOR - this camp focused on the development of lifesaving skills within a scenario-based environment. The Camp provided an opportunity for three of our young members to learn and practise their skills in a fun and engaging way.

CAMP COMMANDO- a group of eight Maroochydore Youth and three mentors attended Camp Commando which was held at Maranatha Recreation Centre. This camp teaches lifesaving skills, promotes teamwork, networking and inter club relationship building.

YOUTH EXCELLENCE PROGRAM - this program consisted of activities that included:

- Teamwork
- Networking
- Fun
- Pathways (internal and external to the organization)

2. YOUTH SOCIAL FUNCTIONS

This season we provided age-appropriate social functions that were both club-based and external, opening events up across to a couple of local clubs as well.

AUSSIE WORLD CHRISTMAS - this event was held in December 2023. We had 32 Maroochydore Youth (U14 - U17) attend and three Maroochydore chaperones from the U19 age group. This fun-filled day included lunch plus all rides and was a great opportunity for Youth to come together and enjoy each other's company. We had Youth from lifesaving, beach, and water. The event also provided an opportunity for the Youth to develop their social skills and build a sense of community.

YOUTH BALL - Maroochydore had 16 members attend the 2024 Surf Life Saving Sunshine Coast Youth Ball at the Banana Bender Pub in May. The ball brought together U14 to U18 members, chaperones, and special guests from

Sunshine Coast Branch clubs to celebrate the achievements of our young members during the 2023-24 season. The Maroochydore Youth Legend Award went to Pipi Barlow.

Pipi is a remarkable individual who embodies the essence of hard work and dedication in all facets of our movement. As a competitive athlete, she consistently puts in the effort and time to excel in her chosen discipline. However, what truly sets Pipi apart is her commitment to support the Club and community behind the scenes. She actively engages in fundraising activities, patrols with vigilance and teamwork, and provides valuable acts of service to her club without seeking recognition or reward. Pipi's selfless actions make her an exceptional all-rounder who serves as a shining example to our next generation of Black Swans.

SKIRMISH YOUTH SEASON WRAP – this is planned for June 2024.

We are also supporting our Youth members through targeted multi-media posts and stories within our private and public pages. Thank you to our Lifesaving Office for excellent support throughout the season. From communications to Youth marketing, we appreciate you. Building pride in our lifesavers and athletes as what they do, achieve and participate in is something to be very proud of.

3. INITIATIVE – MYAP

MAROOCHYDORE YOUTH ADVISORY PANEL (MYAP). We would like to consider establishing a Maroochydore Youth Advisory Panel to involve our Youth Members at an administrative and planning level, and understand that their voices are appreciated, valuable and can be included in discussions in the Club and wider movement. The panel would consist of one representative from the U14 (could be junior captains), U15, U17 and U19 age groups. These representatives would attend a minimum of two meetings per year, including the AGM and General Meeting, and would provide input on issues and initiatives that affect them. The Constitution Committee and Membership Board Member have reached out and would like to setup a meeting to get the ball rolling.

Our Youth programs are enriched greatly by the dedication and guidance of our mentors and leaders who have come through our club's youth pathway themselves. These individuals play a crucial role in shaping experiences for our young members, ensuring that they not only learn important lifesaving skills but also develop a sense of camaraderie, teamwork and builds great club culture.

Special mention also to our youth Water Safety and Nipper assistants who contribute significantly to the success of our programs, creating a safe and engaging environment where children can thrive and grow. We are grateful for the commitment and passion of all those who support our Youth initiatives, as their contributions make a lasting impact on the lives of our young members.

At the end of another year, it pleases me to report that the Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Supporters' Club succeeded in achieving our goals. We have expanded our support and sponsorship to further local Sporting clubs and charities, all whilst exceeding last year's financial contributions to Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club.

This year we continued our long-standing support of Maroochydore Swans Rugby Club and the St Vincent De Paul Charity CEO Sleepout, which the Club hosted again last June. The Supporters' Club began a new partnership with the Maroochydore Swans Cricket club, who in return have held several large-scale functions with us throughout the year.

Despite the current cost of living crisis affecting the Sunshine Coast community, along with several obstacles presented by the ageing infrastructure of the building, we have succeeded in not only completing the necessary repairs to prolong the machinery life of the building, but also achieving significant growth in both our Food and Beverage Departments.

The greatly improved performance of our Restaurant has been a standout. We have endeavoured to maintain a high level of consistency with our food offerings throughout the year and, with this effort, have increased departmental revenue by over 30% whilst reducing our expenses by fostering stronger relationships with our suppliers.

An exciting outcome of this achievement has been key to the Supporters' Club ability to improve our EBIDARD by over \$270,000.00. This ensures that our rental contributions will increase again for the following 12 months. With the vision of working towards the exciting future and rebuild of the Surf Club, a whopping \$527,000.00 has been donated to MSLSC over this period in addition to the donation in kind amount of \$241,000.00, largely eclipsing last year's contributions. This is a result I'm personally very proud of and would like to thank all the hard-working staff here at the Club, who without them this accomplishment would not be possible.

As we progress through the remainder of this year we will strive to improve our offerings to our patrons across all departments; to increase our contributions to the local community and Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Club.

I look forward to another challenging and enjoyable year at the Maroochy Surf Club.











Board of Surf Life Saving Report Drew Moles, Director

We are once again proud to report zero lives lost between the flags this season. The Lifesaving season for our trainers started in early July with one of three SRC courses starting, and the other two courses being completed before September. Eventually we had 40 plus new SRC's members on the patrol roster. Consequently, the team conducted two further SRC to Bronze upgrades, with 20 plus new Bronze Holders added to the patrol roster. This was all before the official start of the patrolling season on Saturday 17 September. The conditions have been typical Maroochydore Beach. We had rips, large swells, storms, sweeps and extreme tides making things challenging for patrols to find the safest place to put up the flags.

We have completed 52 major rescues this season, 9 people rescued on a tricky day on the 26 November, which happened just after midday change over for Patrol 16 with Athena and her team doing an excellent job in tricky conditions.

We have had large holiday crowds commencing with the September school holiday period, before we moved into the Christmas period and then capping it off with the Australia Day weekend. We had 127 First Aid incidents to manage over the season with a number requiring QAS attendance. It was a welcome surprise when we had four days of postcard beach conditions over the Easter break for all the holiday makers and our patrol teams to enjoy, before the hustle and bustle of the Aussie titles hitting our beach. Thanks to all members who attended and completed the Club's patrolling obligations up near the river mouth during Aussies.

We survived three Bulk Wilkes inspections with excellent results. Congratulations to those patrols that were involved. Thank you to our Patrol Captains and Vice Patrol Captains for your leadership and for continuing to support your patrol teams. To our Chief Training Officer, Michelle Burnett and the training team, thank you for the countless hours you put in on the beach and behind the scenes. Running training courses and skills maintenance is an extremely BIG job! Thanks to our Water Safety crew who support our Trainers. We know who you are; the Club could not train without you. Thank you to our Officers for keeping our equipment, 'rescue ready; IRB Officer: Peter Stubbs; First Aid officer: Amanda Massie; Radio officer: Graham Davies and my Deputy Jamie McKinless for his support.

Lifesaving Clubs in Queensland are extremely lucky to have a grant system called the Beach Safety Equipment Fund (BSEF), which is operated by SLSQ. Every club receives two grants per season, this last season we have purchased two IRB motors and a new set of swim cans for the Nippers.

Finally, I would like to thank all our volunteer lifesavers and award holders, and the families behind the scenes, for supporting our members so they can volunteer their time patrolling at Maroochydore Beach. I have been proud to be Club Captain this season. It has been a great privilege and I appreciate all the support you have given me in this role. I look forward to patrolling with you next season.







Chief Training Officer's Report Michelle Burnett

It has been an extremely busy year for training at Maroochydore SLSC. Our members achieved approximately 462 SLSA Education awards and certificates, which is an outstanding effort. Congratulations to everyone who achieved these awards. It shows the willingness of members to continue updating and gaining new skills which will be of benefit to themselves, their families, and the community. New members along with our current members continue to ensure that the level of safety that the public is accustomed to is continued and maintained on Maroochydore Beach.

Skills Maintenance again had a strong participation with 351 members renewing their awards and improving their skills. Congratulations to all who attended and thank you to the assessors, endorsed delegates, and content experts who assisted on the days. The strength and skills of our membership is something we should be proud of.

The training season started early this season in July with the annual SRC and SRC/Bronze Groups with 37 SRC and 14 Bronze/ SRC awards gained. A big thank you must be extended to all our Assessors, Trainers, and Water Safety who stepped up and did an amazing job putting these very big groups through their paces.

Members completed a large range of awards this season: Silver Medallion Beach Management, Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, Observers Certificate, Radio Officers Certificate, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate, First Aid, Rescue Watercraft Induction, IRB Crew Certificate, Silver Medallion IRB Drivers, SSV, and Tractor Induction. Surf Lifesaving is continuing to increase the workloads put on our training officers and this season saw some changes from an administration perspective with SLSQ introducing a new online training platform called aXcelerate which I am sure everyone will eventually get to know and appreciate. The efforts put in by our training officers and administration employees in this area is phenomenal.

I would like to thank our qualified Trainers and Assessors Mike Dwyer, Andy Walpole, Amanda Massie, Daniella Driscoll, Drew Moles, Nathan Moore, and Damon Nixon. 





Board of Surf Sports Report Danny Short, Director

The 2023-24 season saw Maroochydore continue to be a Surf Sports powerhouse. Our club has consistently over the past four decades remained at the forefront of Surf Sports competition driven by an amazing junior program, loyalty, coaching excellence, and an abundance of volunteers on hand to help out when asked.

In terms of overall pointscore at the Queensland and Australian Championships, our Head Coach has advised the following:

Youth State – 3rd Youth Aussies – 1st Senior State – 2nd Senior Aussies- 3rd

How's that for a season!!

And furthermore, if you combine the Youth and Senior results from the 2024 Queensland Championships, Maroochydore come out on top and arguably can claim to be the overall champion club of Queensland:

Our 200+ Maroochydore competitors experienced some highs and some lows across the nine days of competition at the 2024 Australian Championships. Weather and surf conditions were often challenging which tested the resolve of competitors and non-competitors alike. Two of our more favourite events, surf belt and rescue tube rescue, were unnecessarily cancelled. Nevertheless, Maroochydore was always prominent across almost every section of competition.

Our Youth team (U13-U15) were dominant and comfortably won the "unofficial" Youth pointscore and our senior team finished 3rd:

Newport	243	(251 in 2023)
Maroochydore	151	(168 in 2023)

The Aussies serve as the most important performance indicator for the Surf Sports program and this season we achieved a total of 44 medals across Open and Youth competitions against the 47 medals won in 2023 (49 medals was the record from 2022). A further 12 medals (10 in 2023) came our way through the ever-improving Masters competitors.

Maroochydore won 19 gold medals across Youth, Open and Masters competition which equalled our best result from 2022 (we won 18 golds in 2023). One of the key objectives of the Surf Sports program is to offer opportunities to members to compete in all sections of surf sports. Pleasingly, our results at Aussies saw Maroochydore win medals across almost all areas of surf sports.

A full list of our Australian champions and all medallists are listed elsewhere, but here is a snapshot:

• HISTORY IS MADE: Open Women's Surf Boat Gold – Sophie Gruhl, Phoebe Child, Rachel Reiser, Erin Smith, Michael Brooks.

- BOARD RIDING BLITZ: three Gold medals including Grace McManis winning our first Women's Board Riding Championship in the U17s (Grace also won Silver in the Open Women), closely followed by our second championship when Poppi Mendes won the U14 Gold and then Raphael Short winning the U13 Male.
- THREE PEAT: Stanley Jarrott- 2km Ocean Swim (2022, 2023 & 2024)
- BEST U17 LIFESAVER IN AUSTRALIA: U17 Champion Lifesaver Milla Damsgaard backing up her Gold in 2023.
- GOLDEN GIRLS: Poppi Mendes, Mary Thompson, Jaz Edmondstone and Abby Novosel who each won three Gold medals.

The Coolangatta Gold was contested in October and Maroochydore figured prominently over the weekend with our biggest ever contingent competing in the Long and Short Course and Team Events. An incredible effort in her first attempt at the Women's elite Long Course, Tiarnee Massie crossed the line in 4th place in just over 4 hours and 36 minutes. A special shout out to young Aster McCall, who won Gold in the U11 Youth Challenge.

Maroochydore recorded our best overall performance in the 2023-24 Summer of Surf series with standout results from Tiarnee Massie who recorded wins at Freshwater, the Murphy Homes Maroochy Classic and then took out the big finale at the Shaw and Partners Shannon Eckstein Classic. This also landed Tiarnee with 3rd place overall in the Ironwoman series and for good measure was also 3rd on the overall Open Women Board Race series for 2023-24.

The Summer of Surf Series has become the largest and most highly competitive competition outside of the Aussies. A huge shout out to Stanley Jarrott who was dominant in the U15 Male age group winning a staggering six Ironman series and three Surf Race wins to become overall Ironman and Surf Race series winner. Other overall series results were Britt Ackerley (1st U17 Board and 3rd U17 Ski), Byron Dieckmann (3rd U17 Ski) and Joey Short (3rd U17 Surf Race). Shout out to Joel Piper who recorded two Open Ironman series wins but met some bad luck in the final two rounds in the big surf at the Shannon Eckstein Classic.

In probably her best season on record, Tiarnee Massie broke through for a podium finish in Round 6 and landed in 5th place overall for the Nutri-Grain Iron Series. Tiarnee has now arrived as one of the leading Ironwomen and we look forward to seeing further success over the next few seasons.

The Murphy Homes Maroochy Classic got bigger and better in 2024 and is now a Summer of Surf fixture. A record number of competitors, record sponsorship and prizemoney, coverage of the finals package on free to air television via 7+ together with thousands of live stream views and a great venue has positioned this carnival for a great future.

The VIP enclosure was louder than ever, particularly when Tiarnee Massie took out the Open Ironwoman and Sam Short the Open Male Surf Race. Thank you to our major sponsors Murphy Homes and Aussie Fitness Equipment and our volunteer commentators Ralph Devlin and Jenny Parry. We look forward to your support in 2025 where with the support of our Summer of Surf partners we aim to lift the status of our carnival to a "10,000" point event.

Maroochydore were again prominent in the 2023 Pool Rescue season. Overall Branch champions again, 2nd overall at the Queensland Championships in Townsville and 3rd overall at the Australian Pool Rescue Championships. Thank you to our pool lifesaving coaches John Baxter, Sarah McGrath, Jeannie Baxter-Reid, and Team Manager Nathan McGrath.

With the leadership of Jason Bristow and Sam McManis and with the support from Coach, Grant Thomas and Maroochy Surf School, the Fibreglass Cowboys enjoyed its most successful season ever. On the back of three Gold medals and a Silver at Aussies, the Cowboys found themselves on the podium contributing valuable points to our overall campaign. The growth of the Cowboys is a great example of being able to offer a diverse range of competition opportunities to our membership.

Thank you to Jason Bristow, who after six seasons at the helm is stepping back with Sam McManis taking the reins. Jason has fostered an inclusive and socially enjoyable resurgence of the Cowboys. I know Jason is hopeful that this continues, and we both encourage all our more senior surfers (Mal riders especially) to join the fun. Just two comps per season and a few sessions with GT may just improve your surfing!

The Beach Section enjoyed another successful season including winning the Queensland Beach Series once again. Whilst not reaching the heights of previous seasons, under the leadership of Todd McSwan and with Memphis Shield and MJ in support, there is no doubt Maroochydore is now prominent when it comes to Beach competition. Plans are in play to build our 1km and 2km beach running depth with Peyton Craig coming on board to assist.

Unfortunately, after five seasons Todd McSwan has decided to advance his coaching career by leaving Maroochydore and joining Noosa Heads. A massive thank you to Swanny for his passion and dedication over recent seasons and all the best for your future endeavours.

With Michael "Meggsy" Brooks leading the way, the Boat Section keeps improving with another amazing season. Early in the season, Maroochydore's U23 Men's Surf Boat Crew took out their 4th Australian Championship at the Australian Short Course Championships and were selected onto the Australian team as the Australian Men's Development Crew. Never has a Maroochydore boat crew won four back-to-back Australian Championships!

Consistently performing at a high level, the Boat Section is as strong as ever and delivered outstanding results across all competitions including ASRL, Queensland and Australian Championships and the ZENOZ Surf Boat Series. Full results in Meggsy's Boat Captains report.

Another season and another season of Maroochydore remaining a leader in Lifesaving Sport. Lenore Grice continues to achieve amazing results, most notably coaching Clover Youngman and Ruby Misso to Gold in the U19 First Aid plus a swag of other championship medals. With Sarah McGrath taking up a teaching role in western Queensland, sister Selena (with assistance from mum and dad) took over and guided Milla Damsgaard to the U17 Champion Lifesaver Gold Medal backing up from last season where she won the U15 Champion Lifesaver. We were close to fielding U17 and Open Patrol competition teams this season, but our coach had to move to North Queensland. With any luck this will change for next season.

Our Masters section received a kick along this season with the Clint "Matey" Irwin inspired "Get on Board" campaign. As a result, our Masters competitors won 12 medals at Aussies and are on the rise. Can't wait to see this section grow over the next few seasons.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

The Youth element of our club is absolutely humming with Jake Dale overseeing the nurturing of our young athletes and assisting them on their journey to sporting success.

We started the year on Camp at Stradbroke Island, a tradition now steeped in Maroochydore history. This set the foundation for our year ahead, bonding the competitive team and setting the expectations required for a successful competitive campaign.

Our Youth (U11-U15) finished a very close 3rd at the State Titles, before going on to claim the unofficial overall Champion Club title at Aussies (U13-U15) with a dominant display. The last hour on Sunday saw us win four races in back-to-back fashion! This had the home crowd buzzing, an awesome outcome after a dedicated season of training.

NUTRI GRAIN AND SUMMER OF SURF

Once again, Tiarnee Massie had an exceptional Nutri Grain Series finishing 5th in the overall point score and claiming her first podium finish with a 3rd place. With this podium finish, I am predicting we will see a lot more of Tiarnee on the dais next season, as was evident with her 3rd place in the Open Women's Iron at Aussies.

Tiarnee also won two rounds of the Summer of Surf series (SOS). With Iron titles at the Freshwater 5000 and the major "Shannon Eckstein Classic" to sit nicely with the title won previously at the "Hayden Kenny Classic."

Joel Piper came of age in this year's Summer of Surf series winning a round at Freshwater, claiming 3rd at Manly and winning again in Victoria. This was Joel's first year as an Open competitor, and he looked very comfortable lining up against seasoned opponents and will be a real threat next season.

Zoe Longhurst banged the door down in this year's SOS series with a 1st and 2nd placing in the Open Women's Board. Zoe is still an u19 competitor and showed no fear as she took on the sport's established stars and made a name for herself as one of the best board paddlers in the country.

AUSSIES

We walked away from Aussies with 16 Golds, 16 Silvers and 12 Bronze. A true club performance with all sections contributing to the point score.

Our water section experienced a tough five days of racing with conditions constantly changing and our athletes not receiving much assistance from the ocean. We had numerous opportunities to claim wins and podium finishes and did manage to get our share, but ultimately were left frustrated.

Our preparation into the event had been on the mark, with strong showings over the two events leading into the big dance. This is sport and sometimes we are on the receiving end of unwanted performances. All we can do is learn from the experience and get better. We have the history and athletes to bounce back next year, and we will return stronger than before.

The Open Women's Boat Crew (the Chums) won the title, our first for Maroochydore! Additionally, to my memory, the win in the Open Women's Board Rescue is also a first for Maroochydore in this event. Awesome job team.

CONCLUSION

It takes a team to build a club and provide sustained success. Maroochydore has been amongst the top clubs now for the past 10 seasons and in my opinion, we continue to make improvements and get better each season.

Everyone should be proud of their contributions, athletes, parents, managers, directors, and coaches. When everyone is contributing and doing the little things right, we as a club are better for it.

The Queensland Pool Rescue Championships were held in Cairns. A small team of 11 travelled to this event, with our team winning:

At the 2023 Australian Pool Rescue Championships, our team won:

Board of Junior Activities Report Jay Whatley, Director

The 2023-24 season has in many ways exceeded the expectations of the Junior Activities Committee (JAC), however on reflection we shouldn't be surprised because we know we have high quality coaches, parents, volunteers, and athletes contributing and succeeding in Junior Activities at Maroochydore SLSC. As everyone is no doubt aware, the standards held in Junior Activities stays with an athlete, parent, and volunteer through their journey within Maroochydore SLSC.

On behalf of the JAC, I'd like to acknowledge and thank our Life Governors, Life Members, Board of Management, and the wider membership group for supporting our program. There is an open invitation for you all to attend training sessions, Sunday Nippers or Carnivals to observe the great work and dedication shown by all.

As we reflect on the season, it's timely to note that whilst we have many moving parts and are intwined in the fabric across many sections of the Club, the core functions of Junior Activities are what keeps us motivated:

- 1. Teach and train Youth to acquire their respective Age Awards with the goal of attaining the Bronze Medallion Award,
- 2. Encourage athlete participation and success at carnivals,
- 3. Promote parent participation to obtain Awards in SRC, Bronze, Officials, IRB Crew and Driver.

Our total number of enrolled Nippers was around 300 from U6 to U15, with the majority being female (55%).

I have outlined the key achievements from the season:

AWARDS:

- All children and youth obtained their respective Age Award,
- 37 U14 members obtained their Surf Rescue Certificate,
- 28 Youth trained and obtained their Bronze Medallion,
- Seven parents of Nippers trained and obtained their Bronze Medallion,
- 11 parents trained and obtained their Surf Officials credentials.

CARNIVALS:

From a competition perspective our team goes from strength-to-strength year on year. As per previous seasons we are firm believers that the best method to advance the skills learnt in training and on Sundays is to compete against each other and other clubs in a controlled environment.

This season Maroochydore Nippers competed in the following disciplines:

Our attendance at this mammoth number of events and carnivals does not happen without dedicated Volunteers, Officials, Water Safety, Age Managers, Team Managers and Coaches, especially considering the number of hours spent planning and volunteering when we hold our home carnival, the Century 21 on Duporth Junior Carnival.

This season saw a changing of the guard with our Team Managers:

I'd like to call out and note our appreciation to our team of Coaches for the dedication and commitment to your/our kids in coaching and mentoring our young group to success.

Come the championship carnivals of the season (Branch, State and Aussies), our team of athletes were primed and ready to perform on the big stage. Our competition team of around 90 competitors from a maximum number of 300 enrolled nippers. Due to a clash with the Summer of Surf series, our numbers were low at Branch Championships however at Queensland State Titles, the team performed so well it was another tight finish with our new arch-rival North Burleigh. This achievement holds extra gravitas because of the huge difference in numbers of the larger clubs in the State having over 600 kids in their program to choose from and Maroochydore having 300. This re-enforces the success of our Nipper program and demonstrates the skill and dedication of the coaches.

Our results at Aussies were second to none with this season being the most successful on record for Maroochydore Youth. This result again demonstrated the depth and breadth of talent at Maroochydore with Gold Medals being won by individuals and teams across Water, Beach, Board Riding and First Aid.

I'm reluctant to call out individual or team performances, because our ethos is team before individual, however I witnessed at both States and Aussies truly outstanding individual and teams' efforts that made everyone on the beach admire the team culture that is evident at Maroochydore.

Board of Finance and Resources Report

Victoria Berry, Treasurer

Stepping back into this role after a gap of over 20 years, I can happily say that the Club is in a much better position than the last time I was in this role!

Thank you to the Members, Board and Office Staff who have made this a relatively painless experience. A special thank you to the Directors in assisting me to keep their Boards within budget.

When you look at the financials presented in the back of the Annual Report, you can see that it is quite a consolidated report; this is all that is required by legislation. Honestly, if we split out all the accounts that we use, for most people it makes the reports confusing. If you look closely at the notes, there is a split of the Other Expenses to assist you to see where we spent our funds during the year.

The Profit and Loss Statements shows a profit of \$310,699 after depreciation of \$255,795, meaning we had a cash surplus of \$566,494. The previous financial year was \$336,874.

Overall income has increased from \$1,761,849 to \$2,221,607. This is a combination of:

- Grants \$56,623
- Donations- \$130,884
- Fundraising \$105,564
- Rent \$145,245

As you can see, donations and rent from the Maroochydore Surf Life Saving Supporters' Club does make up a majority of this increase of \$313,227; a concerted effort was made this year to ensure that any "extra" funds were passed down to the Surf Life Saving Club. These extra funds are being squirreled away in the building account to assist with upcoming expenses for our redevelopment. As with any club or business, general running costs have increased in the last year. All increases were manageable and for most expenses, budgeted for within section budgets.

Overall, the Club in in a good position moving forward; our bank accounts are sitting at \$503,931 compared to \$344,114 last year, noting that there is \$108,962 in the Building Fund. When you look at the Balance sheet you can see that we also have \$135,672 in a Grants Account, we have purposely put aside any grant money for specific grants in this account to ensure that the funds are there when the expenditure is required.

The balance sheet shows loans to the Supporters Club of \$590,312, this is prior year profits which were donated to the Lifesaving Club for tax purposes, but the actual funds retained in the Supporters' Club to ensure trading and contingency capacity. This year, a regular payment plan was made against this loan, reducing it by \$168,584. This will continue on an ongoing basis so the funds can slowly be repaid as cashflow allows.

Moving forward, an additional Building Fund account will be opened with a second bank to allow for donations and sponsorships for the new building. This account is quarantined in a separate bank to ensure that there is no way that these funds can be absorbed into general club running costs. A Memorandum of Understanding is currently being drawn up around this and will be part of the Sponsor Pack for the redevelopment.

Again, thank you to the Board and Office Staff for your assistance through the year.
